I really loved how Frank's personality came out. His dad had been in the Vietnam war and had PTSD and major depression and had become a recent widower. It was hard to read about his dad. I could relate to this, since my dad didn't do so well after the war. Frank was determined not to follow in his dad's ways.

I found myself getting emotional and teary-eyed even when it wasn't a sad part. I just loved the sparking between these two. There was no flashing back & forth in time. I was very happy about this. I was really caught up in this young couple. Maureen and Frank were as young or younger than their kids when they were starting out. There were some fights and arguements.
