I seem to be one of the few people who didn't particularly care for this book. Oh well.

Series Note:

Sixth book in Erin McCarthy's NASCAR-centered contemporary romance series. I think you could read this one without having read the others first.

Summary:

Eve Monroe is a NASCAR PR whiz, focusing on keeping her two brother's career's in line. So when one of the pit crew members for one of her brother's teams has major wardrobe malfunction on national TV, it's Eve's job to try to get the situation under control. But nothing about her meeting with jackman Nolan Ford goes as she expected.

Including him asking her out on a date. Why she says yes, Eve doesn't know. And why two people so completely opposite get seem to like each other so much is even more of a mystery. But Nolan knows he's just what Eve needs. Sometimes, though, all the chemistry in the world can't help two people get past their differences. They have a lot to work through if they want to make it as a couple.

Review:

I really enjoyed the first couple books in this series but I seem to have lost my zest for this series. I think it's mainly because of the heroine's in the books.

Which is what my biggest problem with this book was: the heroine. Eve Monroe was so utterly annoying to me. That woman't neuroses have neuroses. I wanted to like this book and I really tried to. There were moments I liked it but mostly I was just bored and annoyed most of the time.

Such a shame, too, because there was a lot of potential. I really enjoyed the hero, Nolan. He's a total good guy; the kind us single girls would love to hook up with. And the story premise is amusing. Nolan has a wardrobe malfunction on TV and Eve has to deal with it...only not. Because that initial story premise gets lost and all you're dealing with the whole book is Eve's schizo personality. Personally, I think the book would have been much better served if the author had stuck with the initial story premise of Nolan's wardrobe malfunction.

Because reading about Eve's issues endlessly throughout the book drove me nuts. Eve is practically obsessive/compulsive, overly controlling, can't see the good side in anything, analyzing everything to death, worries over the smallest little detail...it just got to be too much. I felt sorry for Nolan and anyone else who had to put up with her.

By far the worst of Eve's neurotic personality came through during the first sex scene between the two when Eve couldn't stop over-analyzing every damn little detail. It sucked the life and sexiness completely out of the scene.

It's just never good when you get to the end of the book and kinda wish the hero would ditch the annoying

heroine and find someone better. And that's how I felt when I got to the end of this book. Eve still annoyed me; I didn't feel like I got to see enough of her changing, and more so, I don't think I quite understood why she was the way she was.

I really enjoyed this, and it's definitely an improvement over the last couple of books in the series. Nolan and Eve were a lot of fun together and their romance was engaging and steamy. I loved the snappy dialogue and funny banter between all the characters. Nolan and Eve's Oktoberfest outing was fantastic...one of the best date scenes that I've read.

Nolan was such a sweet, goofy, playful, easygoing, charming, fun-loving, and all around nice guy and an almost too good to be true hero. He was also extremely patient, insightful, and understanding when it came to Eve and there were countless times I thought it was amazing that he not only put up with and accepted her grumpy, snippy demeanor but actually found it adorable and endearing. Eve was insecure, crabby, sarcastic, surly, and often times outright bitchy, but I found her internal contemplation, constant worrying, and cranky-pants personality genuine and pretty damn funny at times.

Other than being dissatisfied with the abrupt ending and lack of an epilogue, **Jacked Up** was a highly enjoyable read. This is when I wish there were half star ratings on GR because this isn't a 5 star read but it's better than a 4...so solid 4 ½ stars.

Nolan hadn't spent this much time in a frantic lip-lock with a girl since high school. He'd forgotten how exciting it was to just kiss and not skip straight to the good stuff. Kissing his wife had that same feeling as kissing his girlfriend back in the day had. It was worshipful, awed, desperate, wanting more, yet at the same time, wanting the moment to never end. It was

kissing with the intensity of knowing that this was really happening, everything you had wanted and desired.

I am pleasantly surprised. I've read a few harsh reviews, mostly criticizing Eve's extreme crabbiness, which turned me off a bit at the beginning. However, Ms. McCarthy turned it around in the end and gave us a believable relationship and two genuinely likeable characters.

Eve Monroe is a PR rep for her two stock-car racer brothers, and she hates her job. She was almost a caricature of unhappiness at the beginning of the book. Nolan Ford is the jackman on Eve's brother Evan's pit crew, and she takes him to task after an embarrassing incident on the track shows the team in a bad light. He just thinks she is cute and asks her out on a date. When they get together she is surprised that she enjoys herself, because her low self-esteem makes her believe that someone as happy and sunny as he would be interested in a raging bitch like her. They spend some time together, like what they're feeling, and then up and get hitched in Vegas. Of course, someone as anal and controlling as Eve has trouble just going with the flow, so she starts to indulge her doubts while Nolan just floats on Cloud 9 until he lets Eve throw the proverbial wrench into all of their happy.

I went into this book anticipating not liking Eve. She was, as a crew member says, a total battle-ax. However, with Nolan she is able to let loose and give up some of the squeeze that she holds on anything and everything in her life. I found myself sympathizing with her plight - which one of us has never let a bad situation get to our moods? I spied that little spark of humanity in her from the beginning (she recognized that she was extremely unhappy but had no idea how to change her life for the better), and I was happy to see it blossom under Nolan's patient care. I get the sense that Eve would always have that edge, but living in the moment really began her journey to happiness. The story was lacking in that Eve really needed to flesh some things out with her father, who in my opinion seemed to be the source of a lot of her internal struggles.

I didn't get the sense that Nolan grew all that much through the story, but then again he really didn't need it. While his glass-mostly-full viewpoint may have pushed him toward Eve despite her attempts to repel him, it also gave him the drive to find and nourish that part of Eve that she kept so carefully hidden. Nolan would probably have been happy with almost anyone, but it was nice to see that he found someone for whom he was her only soft place to fall.

I am going to get nit-picky because this book seemed to amp up the editing mistakes that had been infrequent in the previous books of the series. Weren't Eve and Evan twins in the first book? Is Kendall's hair blonde or chestnut? Are Nolan's eyes mossy green or brown? That stuff drives me bonkers, and I can't not mention it. Don't get me started on the homophone mistakes. Oy.

Overall this was a satisfying read and better story than book 5 in the series. It would not be the best stand-alone because I probably wouldn't have rooted as hard for Eve's HEA if I wasn't invested in the series.

Jacked Up is the sixth book in Erin McCarthy's Fast Track series. I have to say I was a bit nervous about reading this one. I adored the first two books in this series. Really, I just adored them. (Any fan of contemporary romance books need to give them a try). The third book was cute but it missed a certain something that was found in the first two books. Then came the fourth book. I was thoroughly enjoying this book until the very end when (spoiler here) the author threw in an illegitimate baby! I was so so SO P*ssed! There was no need for that and it just killed the book for me. Then the fifth book came out and I did enjoy the couple but then again, pretty much out of nowhere (spoiler here) the heroine turns into an alcoholic. Now that didn't tick me off as much as the baby thing but I still didn't understand why the author needed to include that particular plot twist. I'm all for throwing conflict into a story. After all it's what helps us feel closer to the characters, by making us root for them and by making us feel a part of their triumph. But sometimes I don't feel like you need to throw a brutal conflict in a relationship to make the reader care for the characters. Sometimes, the conflict feels forced and therefore makes the story feel wrong thus making the relationship feel wrong. And even though the author did try to throw in a little conflict in this latest installment, it wasn't made into a huge deal and therefore didn't work against the story. So all in all, I really enjoyed this story and I give it a high rating.

Let me tell you why.

Eve. She's been in every book. Her brother is the hero in the first book and her other brother is the hero in the fourth book. She is their PR rep and is exceptional at what she does. But she hates her job. Like, really, really hates it. But she's good at it, it pays the bills and her family depends on her so she sticks to it. I really enjoyed seeing a softer side to Eve in her book and seeing her open up with Nolan about how she feels about her life and where it's taken her so far. I'm not saying that Eve is soft at all so don't go thinking that. She's still anal and controlling, but those are a part of her makeup and they didn't just vanish when she fell in love, which is good. Otherwise it would have made the story seem off. Nolan helps Eve relax and let loose and I thought that was awesome to see. I like Eve. I always have even when I wanted to beg her to take a chill pill in past installments. She knows her responsibilities and gives it her all even though she isn't fond of it. You witness real growth in her character in this book and she is written very well.

Nolan. He is Evan's (Eve's younger brother) jackman. That's right, he's not a driver! I actually thought this was nice because honestly, there are drivers everywhere in this series and it was nice to catch a glimpse at the crew that keeps the cars rolling and winning during a race. I do feel like the author tried to make Nolan's character a little 'deeper' than it actually is. She tried to tell us that he likes being in relationships with women who need fixing and she tried to make us think Eve's family's money was an issue for him, but I never really felt that for him. It just didn't seem right with his character. Nolan is one of 9 kids. He's mellow and fun and doesn't take things too seriously. I just decided to ignore the little 'issues' the author tried to give him and took him at face value – and at face value he is perfect for Eve. He helps her realize that life is what you make it and that it's important to follow your gut and let loose once in a while. Yeah...I liked Nolan.

The family and friend dynamic. That is one of the best parts of this entire series. Erin writes characters that mesh really well one with the other. You just want to hang out with them! It was nice to see all the main characters from the past books make an appearance in this one. You get caught up on all the goings on which is always fun in a longer running series.

The story. Now I am sure that some readers will disagree with me on this but I found it was good. (Now this part isn't a spoiler because it's in the blurb but I know not everyone reads the blurb so be ready.) On a whim, Nolan and Eve get married in Vegas after only 'seeing' each other for a few weeks. I know that some will think this is crazy! And actually, I would have to agree. But I know that even crazy situations like this end up working out. That's pretty much how Jason and I ended up together.
