What a beautiful second story co-written by two talented authors. Once I started in this historical DD/lg age-play story, I didn't stop until I reached the end. The story has hope, new beginnings, and two people finding each other in a rather unconventional way. But it also has a man so determined to have the woman who has possessed his mind that he will go to extremes to claim her, this is the story of Lord Grayson and Cynny.

Hyacinth Heathrow is the oldest of the girls at Talcott house and finds herself, once again, sitting on the naughty chair in Miss Wickersham's study. She will overhear the conversation between Miss Wickersham and Nurse Lister about issues at the home, but also about her being ready to marry to Lord Kensington. The concern is in regards to her being ready and responsible for marriage. While the young ladies are raised and trained as ladies, they know they are going to marry a man to be their Papa/husband, and are kept naïve as far as marital relations.

"Following rules is not always easy, little girl, but one of my young ladies should have enough restraint to behave herself on most occasions."

Lord Nathaniel Grayson, the Earl of Shively, has learned from his solicitor that his late father had made steady payments to several organizations, one being a Miss Katrina Wickersham. On his way to London, he will make an impromptu visit to Talcott House and see the young ladies playing outside, dressed as young girls. One girl, in particular, catches his eye, a blond-haired angel with sky blue eyes.

The plot will bring Lord Grayson in contact briefly with Cynny when he stops at Talcott House. A quick conversation together will have him shocked at the story she tells him, but he believes it all to be a fairy tale. His time in London for the season leaves him unable to even find favor with the young ladies for thinking on Miss Heathrow. Knowing she is to wed, he can't allow that to happen and will show up ready to fight for her. He can't let her wed Lord Kensington; she must become his bride.

"Were you spying on us, Miss Heathrow?" "Yes, Lord Grayson." "Well, then, we shall see to your discipline once we are married."

The story has great chemistry between Grayson and Cynny. He tells her the sweetest things on the way to his home to help put her at ease and even her asking him questions, in crass terms, doesn't put him off because she is so naïve when she asks him about the wedding night. While there are many spankings, mostly they are not overly harsh. The relationship is a big part of the story, and how they adjust to each other and the Papa-little relationship.

"I hope you don't think I've lost my mind when I tell you this, but—I love you, Hyacinth. With all my heart. Now we are husband and wife, and Papa and little girl."

The story will have a cameo appearance of Lord Cavendish and Cammie too that will include punishment and explicit scenes over a letter Cammie writes to Cynny.

When a critical issue comes to light, and an innocent person is being accused, Cynny can't allow her sins to fall upon another and will confess to the truth. Will this be the end of her marriage? Will Lord Grayson kick her out? Hyacinth had never had much in a stable life before being caught by Miss Wickersham when she was trying to pick her pocket. Will her past always haunt her and have those around her questioning her honesty? Maybe the benefactor to Talcott House of the late Lord Grayson, lead his son to find happiness and his own special little girl.
