My Opinion: I didn't realize when I requested this book through NetGalley that it was the ninth book in a series, but luckily, it could stand alone, too! I enjoyed it so much! I loved the characters, who were flawed and realistic. I loved watching Melinda open her heart to people, even though it seemed like it almost physically hurt sometimes. I know that feeling, and Susan Hatler captured it perfectly!

Melinda starts out getting fired from her customer service job, which she absolutely hated, and agreeing to take on the manager position at Bernie's Bakery, both to help out Bernie who is having problems with his health and needs to take a break, and also because some of her happiest teenage memories are when she worked there. Enter Nate, Bernie's drop dead gorgeous son, and Melinda's first love, and the first man to break her heart when he just disappeared when they were teenagers and she never heard from him again, until now. Unfortunately, she has completely closed off her heart to him to avoid getting hurt again and nothing Nate does can change that. She is also still grieving the loss of her father in a hot air balloon accident when she was 14, and because of that she refuses to take a chance on anything that might break her heart.

When Bernie's Bakery comes up for sale, Melinda decides to take her inheritance from her father, which she has refused until now, to buy the bakery since she realizes that would really make her happy. Kindle freebie romance of the week! In this novella, we have Melinda, a laid-off customer service rep who's locked away her feelings and willingness to take risks and open herself up in life. Her equilibrium is upset when Nate, the boy she loved when she was 14, comes back into town after 13 years away, now a really hot guy. Nate gave her a "perfect kiss" when they were young teens and then suddenly moved away without ever

contacting her again, and Melinda still carries deep resentment about that. (Seriously?? She was **fourteen**. Get over it!)

The plot: Melinda wants to buy a bakery where she used to work, and which she's now temporarily managing while the owner/baker is recuperating from health problems. She has enough money from a life insurance policy payout from her father's death, but her mother has finally opened a letter from her father, which tells her not to give Melinda the money until she's completed a mini-bucket list her father left Melinda in another letter. Now she's in a race to complete the list -- which includes "fix your biggest regret" and "only date someone who leaves you breathless" -- before the bakery is sold to someone else.

The plot is implausible but charming, and the "take some risks in life" message was well-handed, if not subtle in the least. I had issues with Melinda's longstanding resentment against Nate, but I guess some reason was necessary to keep them from falling into each other's arms too quickly. The part that really drove me batty was Melinda's reason for INSISTING that no one let the bakery owner, her good friend, know that she was interested in buying his bakery, while she is completely stressing out over whether she can get the money in just a few days. That was just not believable to me. I think I even yelled at the book at one point (the words "Oh, come ON!" may or may not have come out of my mouth).

There are some grammar/punctuation glitches, but not enough to really distract me. It's definitely brain candy, but it's a cute contemporary romance if you're not inclined to be critical and are more into reading it for the feelz.

Every now and then a second chance will come along. The trouble with second chances is usually there is a reason we didn't grab it the first time – and often we need to be just a bit braver than before to not miss an opportunity dropped right in front of us.

And then there are those times when we get a gentle push into those second chances ... even from beyond the grave.

Melinda's life has been – well, let's just say it out loud – kinda a hot mess lately. Still recovering from her father's death, she's out of one job and on to running the bakery of the man she considers a second dad during his recovery of some health problems. What she didn't expect was for his son, Nate, to come back to town and want the bakery too.

Nate could be Melinda's second chance – if she'll let him. Once Nate and Melinda shared a kiss, and for Melinda a lot of dreams. But that was years ago, they were kids and Nate left town without a word. That still hurt.

Melissa wants to buy the bakery, and she would if she could just access her inheritance from her father – but there is a bucket list that she must complete before those funds are turned over to her. Even beyond life her dad wants the best in life for her. For the most part, Melinda lives life on the safe side. If one doesn't take

risks no one gets hurt. But is that truly living? Or merely existing? Good old dearly departed Dad wants her to live – and he's going to make sure she at least gives it her best shot.
