Adam and Bridget get caught together in a crazy storm and end up having sex before they go their separate ways the following day. Bridget learns that she's pregnant and that she slept with Adam Beaumont, a billionaire. He learns that she's Bridget Tully-Smith, daughter to a famous investigative journalist and that she must be the source of the rumors that have gotten out about him. Then he learns she's pregnant and he insists on marriage. But Bridget wants him to love her as she loves him.

There was an awful lot of telling rather than showing. And a lot of "but he was not to know that..." revelations. It wasn't that it was a bad story or anything, but it was difficult to connect to the characters and really feel alongside them when the story glosses over events at super speed. I mean, Adam is pressuring Bridget to name a date for the wedding and she doesn't want to for a reason she can't even understand yet, and she says she's getting frustrated, but I couldn't feel it. I liked the characters and how Adam seemed to have two personalities, one with a vulnerable, gruff side. But overall, I just wanted to connect to them more.

Also, this was decidedly low on the steam factor for a Harlequin Presents. I'd term this a clean romance... Most of this focuses on a very romantic story, sweetly romantic - which I would have thought would be a different Harlequin series. There's also a bit of cheesy (I don't know if a better word would be sappy) moment, while the heroine is sitting on the beach pondering her relationship with Adam and a romantic song (I Will Always Love You) "comes into her heart" which sparks in my mind a video montage of their relationship like a television drama. Not really my thing, but I know a lot of people like that kind of romance. It's just not my cup of tea.

This book was just okay. The writing was just a little disjointed and vaguely unrealistic but not enough that you could really put your finger on it. It was extremely heavy on the telling rather than the showing and in addition used a bit of the "dear reader" structure:

*She knew Adam was getting more and more impatient about setting a wedding date. In fact, indirectly, they would have their first serious falling-out over it...*

The only other salient point was that there was very little high drama or tension in the story and the end was too quick and sort of out of the blue.
