It's an interesting read, definitely an interesting method but it's directed to complete beginners to programming.

The idea here is that things are addressed in a practical way, not theoretical. You'll learn things by trials and errors, repeating code so that the "how to do" gets imprinted in your memory. However, you won't necessarily understand the "why". Also, the author doesn't explain much but asks you to look for answers by yourself. It's obviously the best way to learn. I mean, we humans learn from our mistakes and we memorize better what doesn't work, especially if we've struggled to find what works. Still, it can be quite a steep learning curve for total beginners, and I wonder if it can even be frustrating for them in the end (also considering you don't get responses from the book; you're never sure you get the right or best answer searching the web).

As an experienced programmer who just wants to learn Python, the book isn't what I was looking for. Still, it's possible to just read through the book to get a general oversight of Python without actually practicing. The practice part is what makes this book a good one, but an experienced programmer would find this approach too cumbersome. Then, if you're experienced, you'll miss the theory and concepts you're used to learning in a standard programming language book.

Overall, I don't know how to rate this book. I like the concept, which is new to me, but it wasn't what I actually was looking for to get a first look at Python. I guess I expected something a bit more advanced.
