Pros

Easy to read;

Over 400 pages, but this could be on the negative side for some people;

The book explains how Freud became his own method of psychoanalysis, by painting the era he was living in;

It is good to inform yourself of the darker sides of Jung and Freud during the war. Everyone did what he needed to do in order to survive;

Roudinesco is very open about Freud's experiments with, and addiction to cocaine;

You owe it to yourself to read this book if you are a fan of dreams and dreaming.

Cons

To my surprise, Mark Solms is not mentioned in the book. The man who brought Freud back in the three main scientific ways to explore dreams. It is a shame, because I am quite sure Mr. Solms would have gladly participated on a chapter about modern psychoanalysis;

When you are more aligned with the Jungian school of thinking, you will have to read around the almost open contempt of Jung. We all know that Jung has his darker sides, but Freud also had his challenges; One of the things I missed was a better biography of Freud's disciples.

A biografia de Roudinesco parece ter sido escrita com os antifreudianos e o "movimento" do Freud bashing em mente. Isso por um lado é bom, porque exigiu uma pesquisa muito extensa e profunda, o que faz com que o livro seja muito bem documentado e repleto de notas de rodapé. Mas, para um leitor leigo, como eu, é também uma dificuldade. De alguma forma, a autora pressupõe um conhecimento prévio da obra e da vida de Freud. No fim, é sem dúvida um excelente livro, mas talvez não seja a melhor escolha para se iniciar na história de Herr Professor.

Simultaneously thorough and concise, Roudinesco's biography places Freud historically, showing what shaped him and what he contributed to his time and ours. Does not gloss over his failings, but neither does she let the anti-Freudians get away with inaccuracies. Roudinesco is especially good on boiling down in precise language the complexity of Freud's thought as it develops over time. (Catherine Porter's translation is very good.) The final chapters on the rise of the Nazis, the collaborationist psychoanalysts, and Freud's exile are revealing and moving. (Jung in particular comes off very badly, justifiably; Roudinesco quotes some lengthy antisemitic remarks.) Freud's thought is still challenging and radical in many ways, and Roudinesco shows clearly why that is while also showing where Freud fell short and sometimes ignored or contradicted his most radical ideas, leaving to future generations the task of rediscovering them after the simplifications of his followers and the misrepresentations of his detractors.

Very well researched, although the language is quite detailed and high level. Roudinesco clearly has a very good skill in research and her bibliography is huge, with her even tying in aspects from around psychology and philosophy relevant to Freud.

Definitely wouldn't recommend this to anybody who isn't already fairly well up on psychoanalysis and doesn't have at least a brief knowledge of its history and key figures.
