Amelia is the town's only "doctor," actually a healer and apothecary. Conflict arises when the sheriff must deal with Amelia's outlaw brother.

He abruptly meets the young woman who is Glory's closest thing to a doctor and the rest of the story is all about the attraction they both fight and an almost insurmountable conflict. As heroines go, I was pretty disappointed in Amelia's behavior toward the hero when the conflict reached its pinnacle, given the circumstances, and thought it took far too long for her to regain her intelligence and compassion afterward. However, Landis is certainly a writer who makes you care about her characters and there was an intriguing subplot that you typically do not find in historical old west fiction.
