DeVere is his usual manipulative self and I’m really intrigued by the underlying tension between him and Diana. I can’t wait to read their story.

Among the secondary characters, I really like Polly, Vesta’s Abigail, with her no-nonsense bluntness which made me laugh on more than one occasion.

“Took a faint, my sweet arse!” Polly mumbled once Diana and the others had departed. “Now, young lady, you tell me what this ruckus is all about,” she began her diatribe. “You may have fooled the rest wi’ yer damsel in distress act, but don’t think to bamboozle ol’ Polly.”

There was also Pratt, DeVere’s groom, who gets entangled in all the various shenanigans.

I have one small gripe. I thought Vesta did seem a little too young for Hew but it’s only a minor criticism and it certainly didn’t spoil the story for me. I also appreciate that in the 18th century, gentlemen did marry ladies much younger than themselves.

I’ll finish with one of my favourite quotes.

“I have found only one effective way of dealing with a recalcitrant mount,” he said, dipping his head so his deep blue eyes bored into hers. Vesta forced her breath out slowly even as her heart rate accelerated. She swallowed hard. “And that is?”

With the signing of the Treaty of Paris, Captain Hewett DeVere has returned to England to sell his commission and settle down. When Vesta lays eyes on the dashing Hew, she falls instantly in love. But Hew enamored of the older but still beautiful Diana, barely notices Vesta. Used to getting what she wants regardless of the consequences, Vesta sets out to capture Hew. And absolutely nothing will stand in her way of winning the handsome war hero.

This is the second book in the *Devil DeVere* series. The first book *A Wild Night's Bride* featured Vesta's father Ned Chambers and actress Phoebe Scott. As in the first book, Ms Vane manages to craft a novella with a surprising amount of historical detail, elevating it above the usual short romance story.

The hero, Hew and heroine, Vesta are absolute opposites. Where Hew is mature, disciplined, self-possessed and responsible, Vesta is immature, spoilt, bold and petulant. Having been coddled and allowed more freedom in the country than normal, Vesta has become self-centered and indulged. In line with her impulsive and indiscreet nature, at her first sight of Hew she's captivated. But Hew didn't survive the worst of the war only to succumb to the scheming of this little miss.

Victoria Vane's prose is lush suiting the Georgian period. The dialogue flows with passion and wit. Ms Vane writes humor with consummate ease. And this story is funny! The love scenes between Hew and Vesta are

steamy, yet beautiful. And there's a lovely surprise in store when these two get together.

The dialogue between Hew and Vesta is wonderful. Polly, Vesta's maid has some great lines and is not duped for an instant by her lady's conniving ways. Ludovic, Viscount DeVere plays his hand (again!) in orchestrating a get together between Hew and Vesta. And I'm looking forward to DeVere's story who has a history with Diana.

Due to its brevity, some depth of plot, characterization and details has had to be sacrificed. And the length of time the protagonists know each other before falling in love is short. These quibbles are minor given the strengths of this brilliant little story.
