In 2006, Rick Falkvinge decided to change the world for the better. He chose an unorthodox route and founded the very first Pirate Party. Less than ten years later, there are Pirate Parties in more than 70 different countries, and the pirate movement has become a political force to be reckoned with.

Swarmwise is the story of how one man managed to create a global phenomenon for political change. It is also a tactical manual to how you can tap into the power of the swarm and channel its force toward your goals. This applies equally whether the game you want to change is business, political, or social, and is especially relevant when you have no money and less time at your disposal.

Swarmwise is licensed under a Creative Commons Noncommercial-Attribution 3.0 license – that is, it can be freely shared, copied, given away and format-shifted as long as people credit the author and don't sell copies.

The book gives practical advice how to organize, motivate, and run a swarm following the history of the Swedish Pirate Party, the author founded.

I started reading this as a time sink while commuting, since my audio book was finished unexpectedly. Once method I used to make it easier for people to attend the party management meetings when I was party leader was to limit the meeting to a strict time frame. We would start the meeting at 8 p.m. on Tuesdays, and the meeting would end at 9 p.m., no matter whether everybody thought we were finished or not. That made sure that two things happened: it let people know that they could plan things with their family after 9 p.m. on Tuesday evenings, and it forced people to address the important things first, as the meeting cutoff would happen whether they were done or not. This is a no-crap book on organizing a working flexible structure that can accomplish things.
