Ally, on the run from his abusive husband, was able to settle and have a quiet life in a small town where she was able to find comfort from Frank and Frannie, someone she considered a family. But even after three years of getting help from an organization that acquire new identities for her and her son, paranoia was her constant companion. She felt that wherever she went, there was a cop car sitting, always watching them.

She thought ex-Navy SEAL, Jonah Bradford, could be the perfect man who would protect her and her son; "*a true hero*". He was running their family business, Bradford Securities and what could possibly go wrong? But what held her back was her role of being a mother first and foremost, and the impending danger that will surely happen if she wouldn't let her guards up. While Jonah, having the SEAL instincts knew that there was

something off with Ally. He always thought that she was nothing but scared and he was eager to find out what was she hiding.

I couldn't say that I love the story. When I read the prologue, I thought, "*Hey! This must be good.*" but the moment I started reading the first few chapters, I couldn't help but cringe with what looked like **insta-love**. When someone said "*Can I keep you forever?*" and fell in love instantly which is very unlikely and unrealistic, how would you feel? Okay, I get it and maybe the author just want to sound funny but I didn't get why Ally and Jonah have to call each other "Freckles" and "Mr. Dreamy Eyes"?

She and her son have made themselves a family with Frannie, Frank, Bella, and soon, Jonah and his family and friends involved with his security company.

But, ever since an embarrassing incident when they first met at the diner she works at, she won't give him the time of day. Jonah is determined to get to know Ally, though. An interesting debut from Susan Owensby that held lots of potential. This was a tale of abusive husband and a woman, Ally on the run thanks to an organisation that provided new identities. Most of this book takes place 3 years later where Ally is settled in a town but remains vigilant and isolated with her son.

EX-SEAL Jonah has been trying to catch Ally's attention for a few years but she isn't open to this. Jonah was a very likable character and I did enjoy the chemistry between these two. Sometimes the narrative felt simplistic and there was an element of things being a bit too insta-love for my liking. Nevertheless, I did feel gripped by this tale of suspense until about 75% when it all became a bit too brutal. The narrative is utterly graphic and felt almost too much for what had passed in the previous 75%. Because of the very graphic

nature of the description, I feel I have to mention that this book will be a trigger for some readers. The wrapping up of events was too convenient in the end for me.

I really liked the first half of the book, but the second half wasn't as strong and turned me off the characters and story somewhat.

All he has to do now is convince her of that, as Ally isn't interested in giving her trust or story away it is going to take some convincing.

This is a great story, you can't help but want the best for everyone involved. The only problem is once bitten twice shy, and Ally is definitely shy.

Ally "Freckles" Black has had a hard life. Her now ex-husband was violent and got arrested for drugs and guns possession. But since he used to be a policeman and kept lots of contacts in the police department, she changed her and her son's identities and ran.

Years later, Ally works as a waitress in a dinner and that's where she met Jonah "Mr Dreamy Eyes" Bradford.

Indeed, she looked at him, dropped some stuff and told him "Can I keep you forever?" and the dude fell for him immediately.

Yep. Immediately.

After that humiliating moment, she avoids him for three years whenever he shows up the dinner but he still think of her as his and is very sure they're meant to be. (I'm gonna go puke and I'll be right back.) So, Mr Dreamy Eyes is an ex Navy Seal and now works in a security firm and after he has two conversations with Ally, when she stops avoiding him, he is very sure she is hiding something and starts investigating behind her back. Cause that's healthy...

So the book is mainly about how the men protect Ally without her knowledge and how the women take care of her son, Samuel.

I didn't like the writing at all. Beside the fact that the book was filled with so many clichés I couldn't even list them and that it seemed deeply unrealistic, fake and annoyed me to no end, the writing itself felt childish to me. It drove me insane. I also feel like it was filled with sexism.

They were lots of things like "my woman" or "I would not let you push me away." Do I need to explain why it's not ok?

Their first kiss also happened while she was unconscious, on the side of the road, with a concussion, a sprained ankle, very close to hypothermia and a huge cut in her hand. Kissing people while they're unconscious shouldn't be romanticized, there's this thing called consent and this thing called assault.....

I'm just gonna add a couple quotes that infuriated me :

"A boy needed his father."

"Damn, she colored her hair? Why? Red hair on her would look fucking amazing. I mentally shrugged thinking of how often my baby sister had changed her hair color over the years. It had to be just a woman thing."
