The story opens up with Lucky, a nickname, who was stalking a guy, Edward Letton, at a girl's soccer game. As he calls over one of the girl's to his van, Lucky makes a move and runs this guy down. The man is hospitalized. Same day, a woman gets dropped off at the hospital with severe head injuries. When Gemma wakes, she has no memory of how she got to the hospital or how she got her injuries.

It doesn't take Gemma long to realize that she can read minds and that her adopted mother, used her in giving readings to customers. Gemma struggles with the gaps in her memories, while the police look for evidence to tie her to the hit and run. Gemma's friends' daughter, passes on info that she had been following a man, and Gemma worries that man could've been Letton.

What Gemma doesn't know, is there is someone that was stalking her, who goes by the name of Wolf. He hunts witches and burns them to send them back to hell.

This was a captivating read. The story had some loose ends. One example, Gemma was exhausted, although she had a good night's sleep. She left work and went straight home to sleep on the couch. Further into the story, Gemma wakes up nude and finds her uniform in the hamper with no recollection of anything. I was left wondering why Gemma was so exhausted, and what happened from the time she arrived home, fell asleep on the couch to waking up nude. Overall, it was a good book.

The Good: The mystery kept my attention. I was constantly trying to figure out what was going on and that's a necessary part of a mystery book for me.

The Bad: I wasn't prepared to have to deal with the perspective of the child molester/rapist. That's not a perspective I want to know about nor do I want to deal with sexualized violence. For me those parts of the book took away from the storyline. I also thought that the romantic relationship between the hero and heroine could have been developed more. I thought that there was an imbalance between the mystery and the romance which made both fall short. Also while I appreciated the references to different towns and cities in Oregon, it felt forced to me.

The best in the series so far. I think it should be the second one read, and wish they had included it in the series so I could have read them in the proper order.

From the information given I think Bart (Wolf) and EZ's Mother was Rita's Aunt "Blind Spot".

Gemma wakes up in the hospital with no memories. She is accused of running down a pedophile. Will is assigned to the case and quickly falls for Gemma, with the evidence mounting against her he desperately wants to believe her assertions of innocence. Memories of her life start coming back to her, and she quickly returns to her home where she learns she has been plagued by memory loss since childhood. She also has a unique ability to read people's emotions. When people start accusing her of things she hasn't done she fears that the unscrupulous psychiatrist who wants to use her to make a name for himself is correct and that she has multiple personality disorder.

Meanwhile Bart is on a mission to kill "witches". He killed his Mother (who he refers to as the Mother Witch) and burned her. Now he is killing young women he deems witches and burning them. But the main witch he wants to kill is Ani, who he blames for his brother EZ's death.

Desperate to find out what is going on Gemma allows the psychiatrist to hypnotize her and discovers that she was a conjoined twin. Gemma was left with an old Indian woman Totu (possibly her Grandmother) who eventually left her on the ferry allowing her to be adopted by the La Portes and given a good home. Her twin Ani was given to the pedophile doctor in exchange for operating on the twins to separate them. Anxious to share her news with Will she calls him and they agree to meet at her house.

Will is startled when "Gemma" shows up at his door minutes after their phone conversation arranging to meet at her house, but they quickly have sex, it's only afterwards that he realizes the scare is on the wrong side of "Gemma's" hip. Ani realizes he knows that she isn't Gemma and ties Will up. She then goes to see Gemma, they are interrupted by Will's partner Barb, who Ani shoots. Will who has managed to untie himself quickly arrives and Barb is rushed to the hospital. Ani escapes from the law only to be captured by Bart.

Will and Gemma see the bonfire in the quarry and rush to it. Gemma manages to free Ani's hands before she is forced back by the flames. Bart and Will fight and Will is forced to kill Bart. After the fire is put out they realize Ani escaped, but are unable to find her. Thinking Ani is Gemma Little Tim (retarded man with a crush on Gemma) helps Ani.

I really wanted to like this book, because from reading the back it seemed exciting and interesting. Sadly, it was neither of those things. My first complaint, is that on the spine of the book it actually says "Romantic Suspense." Yeah, not so much. Nothing even remotely romantic happens until over halfway through the book, and when something does happen they just jump on each other without ever having any real conversations, feelings, or conversations beyond the interrogations. It left me saying "Come on. Really?"

The book was also very confusing, and not in a good way. I had no idea what was going on, and then when the "twist" was revealed it was lame and totally soap opera-y. It kind of felt like the writer got to that point and didn't have a plan as to what she actually wanted to do with the story, so she went with the cop-out.

Many things are left dangling and unexplained, and I have a lot of questions. Which would be good if this book were the beginning of a series, but it's not. At least, not as far as I know. I hate to come away from a book and have bad things to say about it. But in this case, it just wasn't good. I have never read any other works from Nancy Bush, so I don't know if this is just how her books typically are, but after struggling to get through Unseen and hating a lot of the characters, and the twist, and the ending, and the plot, I don't think I will read another one. At least, not for a very long time.

Confused and disoriented psychic Gemma LaPorte awoke in the hospital unaware what had happened to her. Investigating Detective Will Tanning of the Winslow County Sheriff Department knew the severity of the car accident had left Gemma with memory loss. With thoughts her memory would return in a few days he was stunned by her denials in the hit-and-run and several reports of her unsettling actions in the days after she returned home. Mysterious deaths and Gemma's connection to them weighed heavily on Will, his efforts to find answers pointed to Gemma. Complicated by his growing attraction to her, he knew he would be duty-bound to enforce the law.

"Unseen" opened with a sinister atmosphere, a dark shadow of doom looming ahead. Quickly the characters were introduced; their personalities and thoughts weaved in layers as the intensity of the suspense increased. The short chapters and the mystery about Gemma kept the pace fast to the end. Expected small town characters, psychic abilities and predatory actions provided texture to the story. Conceptual ideas of how love or lack of love affected the development and future actions of people played out well.
