Humans and Monsters are revealed to each other while the monsters are working to protect Earth.

This was a good final volume to conclude the story but at the same time I felt that it was wrapped up a little too nicely. The artwork was beautifully done and there was a lot to admire due to the abundance of characters. The final fight may have been rushed a little which I feel could have been drawn out more into a more epic battle but overall still left me somewhat satisfied.

A small portion of that was presented in mini comics at the very end, but there was no detail and most of it was just extra small stories, not actual plot or any info as to what happened after the main story ended. I really wanted to see the characters after they grew up and

possibly had families. I honestly gave it four stars for that reason. I loved this final volume, but the ending was just too blah to me to ignore.

This book is rated teen so use your best judgment on whether you wish to let children read it considering there has been some mature themes running throughout the series. The final volume of this series is filled with action as the great flying island crashes into Yokohama City causing a great mess but curiously not a great deal of human life lost. Alucard is now awake and free to wreak havoc on the world where only the few monsters willing to stand against the ancient vampire can stand in his way.

However with the continuation of the last volume something else bad is happening as Moka is slowly dying after being pierced in volume 13. Her Sister Aqua is trying to save her but the wound is severe and only one person is able to save her but at what sacrifice is he willing to make? I guess you'll just have to see when you read this book with the final showdown including various factions of work together to take down a menace that threatens the world. Of course there are various character interactions that show the strong bond many of Tsukune's friends have formed in school and on this quest.

By the way the headmaster and Touhou Fuhai let loose in the final fight as well so you get to see their true forms and watch what two members of the three dark lords of capable against an indestructible enemy. I am sure you know who is going to win but be sure to read this book to experience the feels on multiple levels as we (hopefully) find ourselves ready for a season 3 manga when it finally comes out.

There are many interesting moments in this book but if I had to choose a favorite...perhaps it would be when Akasha Bloodriver returns (you'll have to read to find out how) and we have the beginning of a new transition in Tsukune's life. I hope you get a chance to read the series even though it can be a bit on the perverted side at points and that you will enjoy it for not only the story but also the amazing artwork we get in these books.

Yes, you hear that right. The ending leaves us with quite a few more questions, and also due to some stuff happening, some stuff I would like to see happening. I am also curious about Fairy Tale organization, what are their plans? Will we find it out in the next series? Will there be a next series? I do hope so, I don't want to leave Tsukune and his harem. I want to see him grow closer to that person.

Tsukune really grew up in this last volume, though you can still see, that underneath all of that he is still the same old Tsukune. Just now a little bit different from when he first popped in the school some time ago.

The art is also amazing with how it grew. Since this is GR/BL/LM, I am not going to do difficult and add comparison images here, but check this review on my blog if you want to see images.

I am just amazed at how the mangaka improved. From 2004 were the art is more comic and more playful to slowly adding more and more realism to the characters, the surroundings, the story. From mostly being about harem and ecchi-ness, the plot went up to more serious things, like evil organizations, vampires, ghouls and more. I am really hoping that this part of the manga will also be made into an anime. Though I am sure they can't capture the epic art that it has.

I will really miss this series. It was a fun trip, and I would truly recommend it to everyone. The first season might not be for everyone, but the second season is really rewarding.
