Another in what could be termed as the "Papa Bear is an Idiot" series. *shakes head* Sometimes I really don't like these as I think that while meant to be funny, the fact that Papa Bear is so clueless sometimes feeds into the current media trope of the "stupid male" too much.

In this particular book, Papa Bear wakes up and finds his special honey is missing, but there are several clues. Rather than ask the owl (as Mama suggests) he and the cubs go on a wild chase to find the culprit, doing untold amounts of vandalism that really isn't funny at all to the store owners who are going to find a huge mess. (and while you get the idea that Papa is going to have to pay to clean it up, the point is, throwing

money at the problem really makes no difference in the long run - you shouldn't be destroying other people's property to begin with).

And of course Mama Bear was right all along. Much chagrin on the part of Papa Bear. At least the cubs had a good adventure?

Sorry, can't get behind this one. While there's some humorous aspects to the story, this isn't the one I'd want to see my own kids playing out in the house after having it read to them.
