Not for me

U just couldn't get into this. By chapter 4, I felt like I was barely inching through and gave up somewhere in chapter 6. The main character was pretty uninteresting and the only background we get on her in the first 5 or 6 chapters is that she is both light and dark far and her parents were killed. We are also reminded a couple times a chapter how both light and dark far reject her because she is from both lineages. It begins to sound whiney.

Her love interest is identified early but there was no wow factor to him. Her initial reaction was pretty dull and then the next morning she's commenting on how hot he is...Felt a bit brittle to me. I also didn't like how everything fell so neatly into place. For example, she was being investigated by the wild hunt before the incident but now that the incident happened and involved her friend's family, why not have them both join them for protection? Also, isn't it just lucky the MC was worried about money with her own business while her friend hated her former job? Oh yeah her friend was sexually harassed there so she really is glad for a change. That was how details were presented; the reader can't draw conclusions but is spoon fed them after the fact because they suddenly become convenient/relevant story points. It would have been better if these were layered in before they became obviously relevant.

I didn't see any grammar issues in the few chapters I read. I did feel bogged down with unnecessary and repetitive details. I am pretty sure that initial conversation with Herbs repeated the same facts 3 or 4 times.

This book moved too slowly for me and I couldn't connect emotionally to the story or characters to keep me interested. Maybe a reader with less need for quick plot movement and action would enjoy it.

I had a hard time getting into the book at first. After the fourth chapter I was hooked. I did notice some spelling errors and missing words, however I am sure those will be updated and fixed at some point in the future. One of the joys of reading the kindle version, your books are updated with corrections eventually. As to the story I enjoyed the idea of an organization that just tries to keep the balance. They do not try to change events only manage them to prevent an all out war. That makes me curious how this story will progress. I am looking forward to where this new world will take the readers.

Overall the story was intriguing but the writing had some issues that consistently irked me and removed me from the novel. The big issue for me was redundancy of narration. For example, how many times does the reader need to be told in virtually the exact same language that DJ's father took off once he realized Mama J was pregnant. He's not even in the story apart from this mention, but this description is repeated about five times. Another issue i had was that the backstory was not provided up front. How many times were Ember's previous and now dead boyfriends mentioned before the reader finds out what happened to them? It's a serious piece of character illustration that should have been revealed the first time they're mentioned. I was also annoyed by how Ember does all this research on day 1 of the novel that she conveniently forgets on day

2, when it clearly applies. I'm always bothered by characters when I'm smarter than they are. She just went through this traumatic experience and yet it doesn't inform who she is, despite how many times the narration tells us that she is thinking about all that has happened over the last couple days. Then there was how many times something didn't "set well" with Ember. The phrase is "sit well". Lastly, the end completely leaves the ex-boyfriend storyline unresolved. If it's going to be the topic in the next novel, then the last sentence of this novel needs to be "i'll call him back later" or something to that effect. As it is, that sentence is far enough from the end that it just seems incomplete. I'm tempted to read the next novel in the series but i am doubtful that these writing issues will improve. So who knows? It might happen but in a few months.

This book comes close to being the arithmetic average of four other series by Galenorn. The protagonist is a half-breed Fae private detective. She lives in a Seattle which is modern Seattle plus elves, vampires, werewolves, and any other supernatural creature the plot requires.

"The Wild Hunt" is a semi-official private investigation agency (it's run by a pair of Celtic gods, so who's going to tell them 'no'?) that the protagonist is convinced to join ("if you join us we'll keep you from being assassinated"), and this book serves primarily as an introduction to the cast. There is very little story.

If you haven't read Galenorn's books before, this isn't the place to start. If you have read her work before, and want something new, this isn't it. If you've enjoyed her style of wish-fulfillment fantasy and want more that's the same, you've found it.
