I have never read anything before by author Debbie Macomber but thoroughly enjoyed this short story ebook. What a delight it was. It's always tricky to get a short story to be an interesting read, many feel like they are over before they have begun.

Jo-Marie has big plans for her bed and breakfast and during discussions with her reluctant and moody handyman Mark her precious dog Rover goes missing. Jo-Marie is really attached to Rover and is very distressed.

A search gets underway in the tiny town for this evasive and much loved pooch.

We meet a cast of great characters along the way and the story blossoms into a sideline story that just warms the heart, like a nice hot chocolate on a cold winter's day.
