One day Yamato takes Mei to the library to browse through different books to see if something will spark his interest considering his future path. Upon leaving they spot a little girl outside all alone and crying. Mei approaches the girl called Hiro-chan and befriends her. Soon after the little girl calls Mei bigger sister and doesn't let go of her hand until her older brother, Aoi Ren didn't pick her up.

**Two new characters** appear in this volume. **Aoi Ren and Rin**, twins, a brother and a sister. Similar faces and hair but different in height and build.
