An Illicit Engagement is Cecilia Gray's second novella in *The Gentlemen Next Door* series. This is an entire series of novellas and finishing this one, I have now read the entire series.

I picked up book 1, *A Delightful Arrangement* as a freebie and quite enjoyed the quick, romantic tale. I tend to enjoy novellas, especially when I'm strapped for time. *A Delightful Arrangement* proved to be quite a lot of fun, as did the other novellas in the series; however, I do feel that *Delightful Arrangement* was the best of the bunch and the one that I felt told the most complete romantic story. *An Illicit Engagement* uses the tried a true fake engagement plot device. Chastity Drummond is on a husband hunt. She's looking for someone that will benefit her father's company and help run it. Unfortunately, the man that Chastity sets her sights on does not know she exists. So, Chastity enlists the help of her neighbour Lord Lucas Willoughby, also known as the Matchmaking Baron. He's had six fiancées jilt him only to marry elsewhere, and advantageously at that. Naturally, Chastity feels that being "engaged" to Lucas will draw attention to her and result in her engagement to the man that she's really after. The only problem is that Chastity doesn't love her mark, and her mercenary ideal is complicated by her very real feelings for Lucas. Lucas is also none too pleased that Chastity is going to use him to find another man, especially when he realizes that he'd really like this engagement to stick.

While I wasn't as fond of *An Illicit Engagement* as I was of the first book, I still enjoyed reading it. The premise was great and the characters were charming. Chastity and Lucas already knew one another, so the romance itself was believable in the extremely constrained page count. So why the low rating?

What I liked about *A Delightful Arrangement* was the fact that there is a much broader picture of the hero and heroine's relationship; the development is there and I buy their happily-ever-after. This was not the case in *An Illicit Engagement*. The majority of this book is spent with Chastity and Lucas at odds with her idea for a fake engagement. I liked the sparing and the disagreements between these two, the tension was great and exactly what's needed in a romance. However, the resolution between these two is wrapped up very quickly and has Lucas behaving in a rather high-handed manner. For me, the happily-ever-after isn't there. I feel potential for it, but I ended the novella thinking "that's it?" I wanted to know what happened after the final scene.

While I didn't love *An Illicit Engagement*, it is still a cute read. I enjoy the author's writing style and I would be curious to read a full-length historical romance from her. Ultimately, this book is cute, but I think readers should be aware going in that there are not going to get a complete novel, meaning there's a bit of a lack of

completion with this one. I recommend it with some reservations, but I think readers should start with *A Delightful Arrangement*.

Chastity is determined to marry a man who can forward the family's shipping business particularly in the South Pacific. Her family may be from trade, but she is still an heiress and invited to the best that society has to offer. She sets her cap for a man with clout in government in the area of shipping and trade. It is then that she encounters her next door neighbor, Lord Lucas Willoughby, known as the Matchmaking Baron because six of his fiancées found other men. Chastity feels Lucas' reputation can help her get the man she has her eye on and it does, but in the mean time, Lucas himself has gained her attention and is interested in her.

Cecilia Gray has captured my heart again with *An Illicit Engagement*. It is the second novella in a series called The Gentlemen Next Door.

This time she gives us the story of a young woman who is desperate to help her father keep his company and his fortune by finding a wealthy, connected husband and her neighbor, a gentleman who has been engaged six times only for the women to end up with a friend, a family member or an acquaintance. While, I have read historical romances where the girl plans to marry out of duty and not love, I have never come across a

story where the man has had such horrible luck in finding a bride! (Especially not an attractive catch like the man in this story, Lucas Willoughby!)

The author writes characters that you can really connect with. I may not be from the era that they are, but I can understand their thoughts, feelings and wants. Without that connection, a book can be very hard to read, if you end up reading it at all!

Chastity Drummond is a smart, determined character. She knows what she wants and she will get it. She's a very strong female lead. Lucas is bitter and cautious. He does not want to be used. He wants to be loved, not to be used - even if the using isn't purposely done. And he has the stubbornness and determination that matches with Chastity's. They make a fantastic pair! An Illicit Engagement is the second book in a series of Regency shorts (that can be read as stand alones) and as a short read it was great, there was chemistry and emotion with enough of a plot line to keep you entertained. Saying that it is exactly what it says on the tin, there's no real surprises in the story, though sometimes that is exactly the way a book should be (to cater to those moods where you don't want something serious i.e. in this case between books in a series about the end of the world).

I did like Chastity as a character, I wasn't too sure there was much to her from her appearance in the first book (as a friend of the heroine) but actually in An Illicit Engagement she had much more personality, and was one of those female characters that cares for more than just a dress.

Lucas Willoughby was definitely an interesting character. Normally with male Regency characters the male MC is either a rake or so emotionally shut off from the world that it will take that special woman to break him out of it. This is where An Illicit Engagement actually stood out, because Lucas was somewhere between the two. He'd had six previous engagements and yet wasn't considered a rake, and when he examined it himself he came to some logical conclusions.

The chemistry between the two characters was good, as was the relationship building, though I think the idea was that they didn't even realise they were doing it. In fact it was a very equal relationship, with both treating each other with respect, and wanting to protect the other.

Great as a short read, though there was no surprises in the plot line or the characters.
