Sealed with a Christmas Kiss is a short festive novella by Rachel Lucas. This is the first time I have ever read anything by this author and I was pleasantly surprised despite one or two minor reservations. I didn't realise this was a follow up to Sealed with a Kiss until I was halfway through reading and had become involved in the lives of the islanders. Normally this wouldn't matter as you should be able to read novellas as stand-alone books but in this case despite plenty of background information being given I felt I was missing out not having read the previous story. It took me a while to warm to Roddy and Kate even though we are given glimpses of their previous storyline, I think if I had read Sealed with a Kiss I would have been more interested in reading what happens next. Instead the first half of the story felt slow and laboured and the second half was a tiny bit rushed. Maybe a full length novel would have been a better option as it would have allowed for a lot more development of both the characters and storyline carrying on from where the author had previously finished with Sealed with a Kiss.

Set on the Scottish island of Auchenmor we meet Kate and Roddy who live on a large estate with Duntarvie

House at its centre. These days Roddy is finding it hard to manage the estate and all its needs due to lack of money and the pressure to maintain the grounds and the house. In steps Kate's London friend Sian who runs a wedding website, she has run a competition to use Duntarvie house as a location for a wedding shoot in the hopes that in the future the venue can be used as a wedding location and therefore boost business for the estate. Leo and Maddy arrive from the city for this shoot but soon things turn sour when a mobile phone is discovered full of messages and voicemails to a woman who is certainly not Maddy. Before we know it the whole wedding is off leaving Kate and Roddy in the lurch knowing their house and business is at risk. This is Roddy's ancestral home and he does not want to give it up without a fight.

What happens next was fairly predictable to be honest and you could see it coming from a mile away but it was fun to read how they got to their conclusion. Even though Kate does overreact just a little bit showing her slightly selfish nature but a close friend soon knocks that out of her. I felt we learned a bit more about the various people who lived on the island but still I thought there were little gems of storylines I had missed out on having only just discovered Rachel Lucas' writing and been introduced to the islanders of Auchenmor. One thing I did enjoy about the story was the descriptions of island life and all its characters. It came across as a real community where everyone would always pull together to help solve a dilemma but also everyone knew everyone else and their business which could also be a downside. The feel good factor around island life reminded me of Scarlett Bailey's Poldore novels which I absolutely adore. I could easily see Rachel Luas writing a series based around Kate and all her friends and I hope she does so in the future because I am eager to see how they are all getting on and maybe to explore more indepth several other characters which featured here.

If you're familiar with the happenings in *Sealed With a Kiss* then you will already have been introduced to Kate and Roddy. Now most definitely a couple, the pair are living on the beautiful island of Auchenmor in Duntarvie House together. However, Kate has just had the perfect idea for bringing money and visitors to Auchenmor...to transform Duntarvie House into a wedding venue. Thinking it'll make the perfect back drop for couples to tie the knot, Kate and Roddy set to work on their plan. We join the pair just as they're making the finishing touches to the castle in preparation for the first big wedding which has been booked for (gulp) Christmas Eve which (even bigger gulp) is just a few short weeks away.

However things don't exactly go to plan when the supposedly 'happy' couple arrive and a series of unpredictable events lead Kate to examining her own relationship and her commitment to both living in Auchenmor and being with Roddy ...

For some unearthly reason I'm yet to read *Sealed With A Kiss* by Rachael Lucas (I have downloaded it, it's somewhere on my scarily long To Be Read list...) but it being December I couldn't resist temptation and once realising that *Sealed With a Christmas Kiss* could be read as a standalone novel I dived right in.

I very quickly found my footing with regards to Kate and Roddy. They're both brilliant characters who you'll easily warm to and it's not difficult to pick up the jist of their back story if you're yet to read *Sealed With a Kiss*. SEALED WITH A CHRISTMAS KISS by Rachael Lucas is a short, sweet romantic story set at Christmastime. Unfortunately, I didn't realize that this was a follow-up story to SEALED WITH A KISS until I was part way into it. In hindsight, I wish I'd read the previous book first, as I feel that I would have enjoyed this novella much more if I had.

SEALED WITH A CHRISTMAS KISS is set on the secluded Scottish island where the hero and heroine reside. The hero is the Laird of the estate on that isle and the couple - whose story was obviously told in the previous book - have settled into a routine. The estate is in need of funds and the plot of the book revolves around a plan to turn the estate into a sought-after wedding getaway destination. Of course, there are complications and things do not go as planned.

Oh, I so loved "Sealed with a Kiss", so when I heard that there is going to be a short sequel to this, I couldn't wait and pre - ordered it immediately. I missed Kate and Roddy, and the island, and was so curious to see what they all are up to. I've read immediately after it landed on my Kindle but, as you can see, it took me some time to eventually write a review...

This time Roddy is finding it hard to financially manage the estate , but soon Kate's friend from London steps in: she runs a wedding website and suggests using Duntarvie house as a location for wedding shoot, keeping in mind that perhaps it would bring the interest and they could use the house as a wedding venue. Quickly, a competition is being organized and soon the first couple arrives in Auchenmor. But soon things turn out badly, when one half of the couple, Maddy realises that her fiancé Leo probably isn't as faithful as she thought he is, so the wedding if off. What now? What with the big plans to boost business with the weddings? Must Roddy give up his ancestral home?

I understand that it's a short story but there were things that were much too abrupt for my liking, for example in the first chapter Kate's friend is visiting her and in the next second she's not there anymore, without a word, and I was really confused for a while: what's happened and where are we? The ending was also too abrupt, and just how could the guests suddenly arrive if the weather was as bad as it was told? Those are just details but they make me a little annoyed because I had a feeling that I have missed something. There was just too many abrupt stops, even for a short story, and I guess that shouldn't I have read "Sealed with a Kiss", I would have problems with connecting with the characters, who - in this story - seemed not so welcoming, not so full of heart as in the first book, especially Kate and Roddy.

One thing hasn't changed though: the beautiful, vivid descriptions of the island and Kate and Roddy's friends. They were still this big, loving community, friends who stick together and you could always count on their help.

But altogether, it was great to come back to the island, and see the characters again, as they really felt as good, old friends. This novel can of course be read as a stand - alone, but I would heartily advise to read "Sealed with a Kiss", as it gives a deeper look into our characters and explains a lot of things. Nice, sweet read, a great escape for one, short, dark and snowy evening.
