At A Glance

Shadow of the Blood Moon kept my interest but I was rolling my eyes half the time because of the immaturity of the characters and their actions.

The Good

I think what makes Shadow of the Blood so interesting is that even with its faults, I still found myself glued to the pages. I hated most the characters but still felt emotionally involved in their lives. I don't know how Robin does it.

Shadow of the Blood Moon is great when it comes to suspense, action, and drama. So much is going on all at once, you never know where the story is going to turn next. And Gen has that kind of voice that makes everything feel so intense. I felt like I was knocked off my feet many times. You know why? Because people DIE in this book. People we care about. It was so horrible I wanted to throw the book across the room. But I respected Robin's ability to not hold back and surprise us to such an extent. There were also many changes and many new characters in this book. I wonder where this is all going to go? Book three couldn't come out sooner.

I love the new bad guy. He's straight up creepy, insane, and indestructible. I kept asking myself, "How the hell are they going to defeat him?" It seems like none of the crew will ever be on board to work together. There is so much animosity, guilt, and resentment in this group of people that you can tell it's hard for them to truly work as a team. They try, but it seems like someone is always either dying or sacrificing themselves to stay behind. It was both frustrating but fascinating to read about.

Some of the secondary characters really shined in this book. Unfortunately, I can't mention many of them because they are new and you need to be surprised when you meet them. But I can talk about Joseph. Though Joseph infuriated the crap out of me, he also made this book so much entertaining. I love that he has some options other than Gen and how Gen reacts to it all. Sweet jealousy. Serves her right, lol.

The Bad

First, I really hated some of the actions of the characters this time around. Gen was all around stupid and whiny. Sometimes she deserved the hate others felt towards her and sometimes she didn't but she still did the whole martyr thing and said how everything was her fault over a million times. But she never learned from her mistakes. She made them over and over again. Then she would yell at people, then feel bad when they made a sad faces, then apologize. This happened about 20 times. So childish. She even apologized to kidnappers and murderers when she was mean to them. Ummm, yeah, Gen, you can probably yell at them without apologizing. That's when it's okay to lash out.

William is no longer a likable character for me. He treated Gen horribly. I wouldn't be with someone who doubted and blamed me for harming people as often as he did Gen. Plus, they did that whole makeup/breakup thing about five or six times in this book. And even when they got back together it was for no reason at all. No true "I'm sorry" or "I was wrong." They just had to get back together because they "belong together." Way to build a healthy relationship...not!

The love triangle is no fun at all. I found Gen's back and forth between William and Joseph to be annoying and repetitive. I don't even care who she ends up with. Gen doesn't deserve either of them anyway.

The plot was a little all over the place. There were a lot of abrupt changes and character introductions that seemed awkward. I wish things went smoother overall.

The Snuggly

I was given a free review copy of this book and no money has exchanged hands for this review. And after reading book two without reading book one first I was incredibly confused incredibly quickly. You really need to read the first book in this series before attempting this book. Reason being is this book follows on immediately after the events in book one. This again is not a genre I would normally read and it is not pitched for adults. This did impact on my enjoyment of it. Teenage girls will love it as it is very much a book for the twilight generation, alas I do not fall into this category!

There was only a few issues stopping me from giving this a higher rating. One was I did not like the main character at all! I found her very frustrating and irritating and well a bit of a brat! Yes in the story she does go through a lot but to this reader she does not really learn from her mistakes. The other part was the sudden introduction of a important character half way through the book. This character and revelation she brings does give the book a boost but again I found the introduction of her a bit clumsy. Finally it was really slow to get the story started and the first half was repetitive. Additionally some of the characters actions were completely unbelievable to this British reader. Finally this book has a strong use of current popular music, whilst I understood some of the references and the mood they were trying to portray not every reader might. Especially if as a reader you are not familiar with American music. All of them can be easily goggled however they interrupted the flow of a fairly enjoyable story.

Having said that, the story was adventurous with a good blend of drama and humor. I especially liked the supporting characters who were very well developed and each with their own stories. Their stories did not overshadow the main story instead they provided a greater incite and linked together in a most satisfying way. The supporting characters were a very energetic mix bringing some much needed light touches to complement the level of angst in the book. The mythology established in book one is also used to great effect in this book. This was an exciting sequel to the Blood Moon series. From the very first page you were thrown into the deep end of major chaos with little down time and heart racing scenes.

In this book our main characters, William and Gen travel to Prague in order to look for Gen's mom who has been kidnapped. What they find there in Prague is more than what they were looking for. This story starts out with William doubting Gen's innocents about major news worthy incidences. His actions lead Gen to attempt to sever ties and seek out her own help. This doesn't last very long but it starts a major slippery slope of distrust, dishonesty, disconnection and a whole lot of disorder.

We get introduced to new interesting characters and places which leads you deeper into the Blood Moon world. As we meet these new people and visit new locations we get a better understanding of what is going on. While lots of the original characters return the new ones are just as interesting with their own motives and unique abilities.

The only issue I had with this book is the back and forth of feelings and relationships between Gen, William, and Joseph. At times I kind of just gave up on who to root for, if either one at all. The good thing was that I was emotionally involved with both lead male characters but the situation was a little exhausting. Either way, as some point I was still hopeful for both. None the less this book was still a good read just emotionally draining which can be a good and/or bad thing.

It's always interesting to see how an author differentiates her book from the next author and Robin has done a stand up job. The anticipation of what is to come is monumental at the end of this book. The author, Robin Waldrop, hit her stride with this one. No one can compare this book to the Twilight Series (not without losing all credibility). The story is unique and riveting. There are enough action and plot twists to keep anyone turning the page. The characters were very well developed and scene description was vivid.

Gen has grown up a lot. I could relate to her much better than in the first book. Her feelings and reactions are no longer completely self-involved. Gen's struggle over decisions in impossible situations made her a much more empathetic heroine. She's still Gen, just more likable, which makes the relationships of the love triangle more believable. There is something for the guys to love. Waldrop didn't completely abandon the mystical angle between Gen, William and Joseph, though. She just backed it up with real people. I tend to favor Joseph. William is way too moody. William and Joseph are slowly becoming Will and Joe, while Gen is more often called Genevieve. I'm not sure how I feel about that. I guess Gen's name change makes sense, given her position. I can even see Joseph calling William, Will. The one I have a problem with is Joseph. Joe is just...
