I seem to be reading genres I don't usually read just because I've read as a favor to the author. This is the case with talented author, Sierra Rose and her novel *Flames of Betrayal*. This is a 265 page military book packed with full throttle action from page one.

This story features a group of Navy SEALs, two squads belonging to the same unit. There's a roll call roster of all the principal players before the story begins, but each character is eventually fleshed out more fully as the tale progresses. I'm not in or of the military so connecting with any of them was very hard for me. I'm sure those who enjoy this genre will do better than I did.

This tale is full of action from the get go just like I mentioned earlier. Despite not really having a military background, all the fight scenes and interactions between the different people make sense to me - very realistic and believable. It is so much so in fact, I found my pulse was racing during some of the more intense fight scenes. I'm glad there were no senseless descriptions of blood and gore that don't help further things along - to me these not only ruin the scene, it lowers my respect for the author.

The author, however, is very talented and in my humble opinion, spun another tale of pure gold.
