It took me a little longer to get through Atlantis than the first book, due I think to the large number of initial subplots taking us in multiple directions right from the get-go. It confused me at first, because there was so much immediate action and very little true buildup, but as a middle school teacher, I know the kids often want to get straight to the action so I can sympathize with the author's creative direction on that. I had a lot going on that kept pulling me away, then I'd forget where I left off and would have to reread... that sort of thing.

Anyway, with all of the treasure hunting that goes on before and during the characters' time in Atlantis, the book took on a 6th grade 17th c. National Treasure vibe in written form. There were traps, hidden rooms, secret passageways, etc that were all reminiscent of a good treasure hunt.

There were a few typos that made it past editing, and a few inconsistencies where a character was called out by name in someone's head before the character was actually introduced. If you aren't paying attention to it, it's easy to miss. I went back and reread one section because I thought I missed the introduction, but it just came shortly after. Personally, I think there was an overuse of word elongation (help-p-p-p, heyyyyyy, etc), but that sort of thing probably doesn't bother most readers.

Overall, another good read. All of those subplots I mentioned earlier get tied together at the ending, just like they all did in the first book as well. The book leaves us at another nice spot for the third installment in Jon's adventure. There were a ton of revelations about Jon's whole backstory in this book that need following up on!

The lead character is Jon Sinclair, along with his grandfather and several friends, on their way to Crete. There they will begin a treasure search with the goal of finding the Lost City of Atlantis. We find out a lot about Jon's history in this tale, information I hope wasn't already revealed in the first book, but all of it interesting and supportive to both the story and our understanding of the main character.
