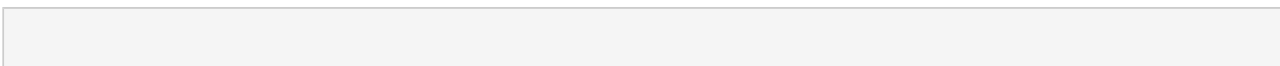

There are quotes and verses strategically placed between the text to make it read easy. It isn't just page after page of text with no breaks. To me this makes it easy to read and absorb.

Each chapter begins with a quote or a scripture.

Personally the chapter that stood out for me was Chapter 4 Confidence/I Can't See God's Plan in This Pain. The other Chapters include: Promises, Peace, Love, Grace, Hope, Strength, More.

And the last Chapter Home/ I have a Future. . . ". . . I saw something that was breathtakingly clear to me. I saw not only that all the promises of God are fulfilled in Christ to offer us shelter, but that He is the Shelter. He is the Cleft in the Rock. Christ's promise is to us is not that He will give us shelter but that He will be our Shelter. "

The Shelter of God's Promises is both for personal use and for group study.

This is a book written by a woman with an open heart taught by God. Sheila Walsh speaks out of experience, and from a voice of love, teaching and inspiring the reader.

Her ten chapter topics are:

Promises, Promises/I Need Something to Hold On To;
Provision/I Don't Have Enough;
Peace/I'm Afraid and Feel Alone;
Confidence/I Can't See God's Plan in This Pain;
Love/I Don't Believe That Anyone Could Really Love Me;
Grace/I Have Failed;
Hope/I'm Broken;
Strength/I Feel Things Are Crashing Around Me;
More/I Know There's Something Better;
Home/I Have a Future.

Each topic is skillfully and tenderly addressed as she shares in a one on one manner, sometimes in humour – sometimes from pain and vulnerability – what God has revealed to her.

For someone who is seeking some answers, this may be the book to read. For someone seeking comfort in a hard place, for someone needing further insight – at the back of the book is a study guide with questions to consider after each chapter. It's divided into four brief sections: Discover; Believe; Live; Memorize (with a scripture verse to memorize that week.) Taken seriously, the questions will help to motivate a deeper walk with Christ.

Even if the reader chooses to not use this book as a study it will still be an inspirational read of comfort and encouragement.

The Shelter of God's Promises is one of the latest books by author, speaker and former 700 Club host, Sheila Walsh. The promises she shares are all centered on Jesus -- the cleft of God -- and His assurance to be our shelter. Drawing on her own personal experiences and using insightful summaries of scripture, Sheila makes the case that we have refuge in God. If you're facing a storm, God's promise to BE your shelter is hope you can cling to. If you're not in the storm now, prepare by taking God's word to heart, because storms WILL come. It's not "if" but "when". To assist you in applying the lessons to your own life, the book has a Study Guide included for personal reflection or group discussion.

Over all, I liked the book. While some of the personal narratives felt forced or even out of place, the spiritual perception demonstrated in Sheila's accounts of scripture are quite inspired. Although I never formed a clear picture of the structure intended by the book, The Shelter of God's Promises still spoke to me and helped my understanding of the fact that God is always with us, caring for us and protecting us "in the midst".

The most meaningful part of the book for me was the very last part. Sheila talks of the perspective of John the Baptist at the end of his life. John, having devoted his entire life to "making a way for the Lord" was beheaded after suffering in prison. How must he have felt when he realized that Christ would not intervene? It is recorded in Luke 7:20 that he sent two of his disciples to Christ to ask 'Are you the one who is to come, or should we expect someone else?'. In Luke 7:22-23 Jesus answered, "The blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cured, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is preached to the poor. Blessed is the man who does not fall away on account of me." The majority of that scripture is quoting Isaiah 61:1 but it omits the part of the verse that speaks of freeing captives. John would have recognized the omission. Surely his heart sank as he digested the message: he would not know the freedom Christ came to bring...not yet. The crux of the matter is a question that we all must face at one time or another in our lives. "...will you love and serve a God you do not always understand?...God could intervene, but for reasons known only to Him, He does not." (p.181)

The answer that gives me the most comfort comes from I Corinthians 13:12: "Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known." Sheila Walsh states, "We are a people who do not live for this world. This is not our home. But until we finally see Jesus face-to-face, He has promised that he will never leave us. He has promised that He has gone ahead of us to prepare a place for us" (p.182). Stand on that promise!

Sheila Walsh has never disappointed me. Her writings cut like a cleaver to the heart of a matter, and yet she does so with humor and steadfast love. This time she cuts through the question, “Why do bad things happen if God is all-powerful and holy?” by examining His promises.

“This is part of a test, scripture tells us. Jesus sends us out to stand on God’s promises and retreat with Him when we’re discouraged—but then go back out again. Will we believe in what He promises to do through thick and thin, dinner or no dinner?”

Walsh examines biblical people who struggled in much the same ways as we struggle in our day-to-day. Her book digs deeply into scripture, examining the Greek, pulling from other sources, and showing us that God loves us too much to break His promises. He loves us in spite of our choices.

“My new friend in the park had become someone unrecognizable even to himself, isolated and avoided. He lived in a place of unrest, loneliness, and self-loathing. Do you know a place like this?”

In later chapters, Walsh talks about the woman at the well, “It was a divine necessity and command that Jesus had to take (the road to Samaria)—there was a woman who needed to know that her life mattered.” There are many quotable portions of the book and it loathes me not to post them all. She includes a Bible Study in the rear of the book. The Shelter of God’s Promises is full of the scripture, personal stories, love and humor that her fan base has come to know and love.

After receiving this book from BookSneeze I found myself gazing through the chapters to attempt to gather what this book was further about. It instantly caught my attention after finding that she was making this book relatable to all scenarios women might encounter.

Sheila Walsh divides each chapter with things we can correlate with promises God gives in the Bible. The last chapter was definitely memorable, and after I was finished reading I found myself walking away with insight I hadn't had before about how God uses occurrences, and lives in the Bible to show us he is always with us. The chapters nicely begin with a personal story she shares to show the theme occurring in modern times, and then she uses the rest of the chapter to explain an instance that Biblical characters would have been faced with a similar situation.

I mentioned that as I read I found something relatable about it. I wouldn't say this book is targeted toward my age group of early 20 somethings', but it provides something for everyone.

This book definitely probably works better in a group discussion which it is designed for. Men will also find examples from the Bible that would be insightful for them, but the book is is mainly targeted toward women. Overall this book is a quick, insightful read.

Just yesterday I was watching and discussing one of Sheila's appearances with Women of Faith at my ladies bible study and today I am reviewing her newest book which is a DVD based bible study and lesson guide. I did not have access to the DVD so this is a review of the participant's guide only.

This bible study is about the Ten Promises that the Lord has given us:

Jesus - I Need Something to Hold On To

Provision- I Don't Have Enough
Peace- I'm Afraid and Feel Alone
Confidence-I Can't See God's Plan in this Pain
Love- I Don't Believe that Anyone Could Really Love Me
Grace- I Have Failed
Hope- I'm Broken
Strength- I Feel Things Are Crashing Around Me
More- I Know There's Something Better
Home- I Have a Future

This study is set up in a similar fashion to recent Beth Moore studies I have done. A bible study watches the DVD together then discusses it in their small group. Then there are four lessons for the participant to complete independently. The book is well laid out with introspective questions that challenge the participant.

From what I can see without having read the book or seeing the DVD lessons, I believe that this will be a great bible study and I will recommend it to my bible study.
