Dead to Me is a 10-page novella linking The Dragon Heir to The Enchanter Heir. I'm very grateful for this because, as you might recall, I complained about the different characters in the two books just a while ago on one of my Waiting on Wednesday memes. So thank you so much Cinda for actually making the transition easier on your eager fans.

This novella is available exclusively on Goodreads, and even better, it's absolutely free. Of course, I doubt anyone would pay for ten pages of words anyways. Leesha Middleton - the girl everyone hates - happens to be the main character this time, and she's still in mourning over her not-so-boyfriend's death. I love how she's really changed from being a backstabber to a romantic; it proves that people really do change. Leesha is so deep in mourning (it's been a year) that she spends all her days and nights with her aunt, and never changes out of her sweatpants. Pretty good life if you ask me, minus the never-changing-clothes thing.

To try and get her to cheer up, Leesha's aunt sets her up on a date, where she gets to take a short trip to London, go shopping, and try and keep her "date" from touching her. This includes blistering his hands and shooting fire at him; unfortunately, he still manages to get a whole bunch of slobbering kisses all over her. That is, before the zombie/revenants come and suck out all his magic.

Even though you usually don't get much in ten pages, Cinda's writing was exactly what it claimed to be: a transition between the last book and the newest one. There was just the right amount of information; just enough to keep you reading 'till the end without wondering why the heck you're reading it. It's so much better than other novellas I've read. *Dead to Me* also happened to get me even more excited about the next book coming out. I can't wait to see what happens with the evil - at least I think they're evil - undead things that eat magic. There's also a bald, muscular guy in the novella, who I thought seemed perfect for Leesha, especially since he seemed to hate wizards so much. I hope that they become a couple in the next book!

For those of you who don't know, The Enchanter Heir has many new characters, and is expected to be released October 1st of this year.
