But the narrator detracts from the story, rather than enhancing it. If she would only breathe normally, instead of showing off that she can read several long passages without taking a breath, or pausing for natural breaks, then it would be so much better. As it is, her narration detracts rather than enhances. Narrator for the version I listened to is Celeste Lawson.
