If you're in it for the main romance, note that he doesn't meet Ruby until about 70% into the book, but Slate's life and his life's journey is what make this a good book for me. (Note: I'm astounded and happy about this since I couldn't get through the first book in this series - a lot of characters reoccur from that first book, and I'm fine with knowing them through later books in the series rather than that first one. If I were a beta reader for the author, I'd suggest re-editing that first one so more people would get to know this lovely series).
