I found it extremely difficult to decide upon a rating for Lovestruck. Anyone who follows my reviews will know I'm a big fan of Siobhan Davis, and it pains me to give this story a low rating. At first a part of me was willing to give a two-star rating instead of the one-star rating I gave, but in the end I couldn't quite do so.

Throughout True Calling, I found myself slowly warming towards Cal. I wasn't crazy about his character, I wasn't as crazy about any of the characters as I have been with other Siobhan Davis characters, but of the two love interests we were introduced to, Cal was my preference.

With Lovestruck, I found myself disliking Cal. He went from being a character I was interested in, the love interest I was hoping would be end game, to a character I found creepy and stalker-like. A part of me fears it's because of the time when this story was written – it's been a few years since this story came out, and people were still caught up on the creepy Twilight feel back then – and I could feel the creepy Edward Cullen vibes reaching out to be me.

I'll still be reading the second True Calling book, but I'm going to pretend Lovestruck didn't happen.

This is a good novella for fans of the True Calling series. It is Cal's perspective and gives more background into his friendship with Ben, his family dynamics and shows how completely head over heels in love Cal is with Arianna.

I loved getting to see Cal's friendship with Ben. It makes me like Ben's character even more. It was very illuminating to see more of Cal's family dynamic. You understand more deeply how close he is with his sister Melandra (Mel) and why. You also see the true depths of how despicable his father is. I won't spoil it but, it's truly despicable!!

It was funny at times to hear Cal just be so completely devastated by his love for Arianna, and her complete obliviousness to it. His voice is very funny and easy to read. Like a few other readers have stated, Cal's obsession did border on creepy at times. At least however, the author gives him the realization that his behavior is creepy, and by the end of the novella he's moved from just watching her, to actually trying to interact with her. I think this is what saved it from being too creepy.

When reading this series, I have to remind myself to get in the mindset of a teenager again. I think a lot of authors who write YA actually make their characters maturity level closer to college age. Siobhan actually gives her characters the maturity level typical of their age. So, when I'm thinking in my head, "Woah, Cal, she's just a girl, slow down, you're a bit obsessive." I remember the friends I had that were totally obsessed with their crushes. The hormones are going crazy at this age and teenagers aren't that rational all the time.

I also have a theory that it's possible that they have already been tampering with the teens who will participate in The Calling. I think these obsessive thoughts could partially be due to tampering done to Cal already. I know from later books in the series that they do tamper with the participants of The Calling, and I think it's possible that it's already occurred.

Some novellas I really enjoy, but for the most part, I'm not a fan of them. I generally feel that they shouldn't cost anything given the short nature of them. Occasionally though, there are the rare ones that do add more depth to the story. That's how I felt after reading *Light of a Thousand Stars*, *True Calling* #2.5. I felt like the backstory love affair between Ari and Zane was a crucial part to understanding the pain Zane feels towards Ari's indifference and skepticism of him in book one.

This book, *Lovestruck*, is not a novella. It is considered a short story and it's told from the POV of Cal. I often thought Cal seemed awfully stalkerish in *True Calling*, and this short story cemented my feelings of that even further. Since I'm not really a fan of Ari and Cal together....I couldn't rate this higher than I did. It was okay. No major dislikes about the book itself. But I didn't feel like I gained anything significant after reading it. No major insights to who Cal is other than his infatuation with Ariana from the moment he first saw her and the fact that he actually has a deepness to him that we don't get to see much of.

Cal Remus could have any girl that he wanted. Except that he has his sights on the one girl that can't seem to

stand him; Ariana Skyee. But if Cal is one thing, he is determined, and if his normal charm offense won't work on her, then he will find another way, even if his best friend Ben despairs of him. Set in the events running up to the Calling, it gives Cal's view of Ariana and Novo.

Lovestruck is only short, but I do think that it gives an interesting insight into Cal and his feelings for Ariana. From True Calling (which I do think should be read first) I don't think it was clear quite how long those feelings had been going on and this just opened my eyes to it (doesn't hurt that I loved the Cal-Ariana pairing).

It was also interesting getting a true account of what went on in the Remus household. Things came across as bad when he told Ariana in True Calling, but actually I think reading about it in Lovestruck made Cal seem like such a stronger person. It also explained a little bit why he was the way he was.

The other thing that really stood out for me was the depth of his friendship with Ben. It was already clear they were good friends, and on earth they had their foundation for helping teens come to terms with their sexuality, so they were clearly close, but this really drove it home.

It was interesting to get Cal's perspective, even on such a small part of his and Ariana's relationship!
