I loved Saint from the first book and I don't know if he was as great in this as he had been in Thomas & Margo's book. I sort of felt that this book lacked the humor and how good the plot was in the last one. It was still pretty great but it seemed a bit more focused on the erotica side and not so much on the paranormal set up and execution. I would have liked a bit more of background for them both.

I liked that the author made the choice to show a heroine who wasn't your typical single, white female (minus the psychotic implication). I have always liked the idea of a biracial couples in fiction. Too many authors stay within the box where the men are either caucasian gods or rugged cowboys and the females are the flavor of the week from the descendants of the European colonization of the world and they are fair of face and have bodies that run along the lines of anything but average.

Being someone who has been deeply addicted to the MMO World of Warcraft for too many years I was able to imagine the structure and the storyline of Saint's fantasy world. Remember in my review of *My Shifter Showmance*, the first in the *Shifting Realities* series, how I said R.G. Alexander's erotic novellas are quirky? Yeah. *My Demon Saint* takes us past quirky and into...did I just read what I think I just read territory.

My Demon Saint is the story of our favorite half-demon, Saint. He's also known as Sinner in the online video game he created. He gets his demon rocks off by "connecting" to people as they play online, sinning and fighting and being not-themselves in an altered reality. The technophile of the three Showmance roommates, he's constantly logging in – whether it's by computer or his trusty BlackBerry.

With me so far?

Through a chance encounter, Saint connects with Ume. Bedbound after a car accident left her physically damaged, she loves to play around in Saint's game. Running, jumping, fighting...it's become an addiction to her. And then one night she meets a warrior within the game.

And that's when things get a little outside my comfort zone.

Let's be blunt – the two characters have sex within the game though both people who are technically in control of those characters can actually feel everything happening to their characters. Got that? And then Ume gets pulled INTO the game...and we get to experience an altered-reality ménage. Like you do.

Overall, the writing is pure R.G. Alexander – naughty and witty with pure heat behind those sex scenes. My issue with the novella had more to do with me being way outside my area of reference. And I mean because of the video game stuff.

I don't play video games – never have – so the whole world within the game and subculture is completely lost on me. I liked the novella but couldn't relate as much as I wanted to. And I really wanted to – something about Saint makes me stand up and do the hair-flip-shoulder-lift-half-smile, you know?
