I received a copy of Scent of Valor in exchange for my review.

Since finally figuring out her shift trigger, Kele has quickly raised through the standings of her pack, but all the time she's been pining after Peder, a shifter from a different pack and an omega, seen as the weakest members of the pack. When a mating is all but forced on her, Peder is determined to fight for her, little expecting that they'll be captured by slavers. Dragged off to be sold, Peder and Kele finally find each other again, and discover that everyone else can tell that they love each other. To survive, Peder can't act like an Omega wolf anymore, and has to grow into the Hunter he was trying to become for Kele...but is that all he has become, or is he now something more?

Scent of Valor is book 2 in the series and I haven't read book 1 (though I fully intend to) but having read several books by Annie Nicholas before I knew that I really wanted to read it. There were several back plot points that would have been more clear in the details if I'd read the previous book, however I don't feel that I missed out much by not having read it and still enjoyed the intricacies of the plot without having done so.

I loved the intricacies of the politics in the wolf packs, and the fact that there were 'classes' of wolves and they were all good at different things in the pack. Of course this did come into question a bit with Peder, because he thought he was an omega (the care givers/easy lovers of the pack) and yet didn't actually act all that much like him.

The relationship between Peder and Kele was interesting. There was respect there on both sides and it genuinely felt as if they worked together as a team. They each took on completely different characteristics around each other, such as Kele acting less dominant, which was difficult for her to some extent.

I couldn't help but feel that some of the events in the book were of a sensitive nature, namely to do with the slave pens, and I couldn't help but feel a little shocked, and horrified, by some of the events, but I did think that the author carried them off well.
