This single issue is very unique. Rather than a story arc of any kind, this is a short informational issue with accompanying art work that portrays some of the Dawn of the Jedi era. This is another attempt on my behalf to get into the Star Wars universe. I've seen all the movies, many of the Clone Wars, read a few series, but I am still stumped by my 10-year old son as I guess I don't have a good handle on things.

I found a reading order list online that is supposedly maximized for Marvel Unlimited. At least it's something. This is the first thing recommended to read. And from what I read, this makes sense.

This is a reference book for Tython, the solar system that housed the Je'daii. Je'daii seek balance. Eight pyramidal ships, known as Tho Yor, flew here and float above their structures. A Je'daii is expected to learn from all areas here.

This is an interesting book that provides some background. This takes place thousands of years prior to the story known in the movies. This is ancient times, before the Jedi and Sith philosophies were codified, according to the book. I can see referencing this later.

One item of note. I read Marvel Unlimited on a 7" Nexus tablet. I found some of the text quite difficult to read. There appears to be no way to enlarge the text.
