We meet a young woman whose name is Kara, (not Marissa). Kara lives with her mother, and her step-father Ted, and she is getting ready to go into Nursing School, which is her dream.

Things drastically change for her.

So how does 'Marissa' fit in all of this?

This is just the very beginning of the story! Hold on! You've got a long ride ahead of you full of twists and turns so unexpected, you'll never know what's coming, or what hit you!

Melissa Foster pens this 'intense' Psychological Thriller leaving you on the edge of your seat flipping the pages as fast as you can. All Kara ever wanted to do was to lead a normal life, go to nursing school, and get away from her cheating husband. But an overprotective mother, a sinister stalker, and secrets with deep roots combine to throw Kara into a shadowy nightmare of real and implanted memories.

The setting of an aging coal plant, sealed off tunnels and graveyards of outdated machinery create a horrifying atmosphere where blood, bodies and suspicious odors lurk around every corner. The story reeled me in from the start and I could not let go of it, no matter how scary. A movie ran through my mind, complete with sound effects, creepy music, and the shuffling of the villain, raspy breathing, and that voice calling in the dark. Yet, love and devotion shone deep inside the chamber of horrors. The characters were realistic and admitted things to themselves that most people hid or denied. Separated from a husband she knows betrayed her, though all her friends and even her mother say she's imagining it; struggling with a dead-end job because she put her dreams on hold to help the betraying husband; estranged from her mother because she doesn't get on with her father-in-law; what more could go wrong? But just as everything might go right, the past catches up with her.

Roland's had a tough life too, with cops watching his every move for all that he hasn't put a single foot wrong in years—well, he's never been caught putting a foot wrong anyway. Separated from the twin he loved, he dreams of one day finding her, and he has the technology and the tenacity to make his dream come true.

Dreams soon turn to nightmares in classic horror style—dark corridors, rolling thunder, scary secrets, saviors who insist on walking alone... Author Melissa Foster brings the world of a coal-fired power plant to vivid life as Kara goes about her everyday job. But suddenly a much more scary world is revealed. Kidnapped and

powerless, she doesn't even know why her attacker gives her a different name. And the slow reappearance of forgotten memories doesn't improve her confidence. Just how many people have lied to her?

The paragraphs are sometimes choppy, reflecting the character's conflicted and multi-directional thoughts. Repeated analysis of what's real and why she's here make the tension rise slowly, and rise it does. Meanwhile everyone does what everyone thinks is best, keeping secrets, telling lies, and laying the groundwork for tragedy.

In the end the question of who's to blame matters less than the chance to build and rebuild relationships. We all make mistakes and nothing's perfect. But moving on means moving together and the story draws its characters into a pleasing conclusion as troubled Kara steps forward, rewriting her plot.

Scary, haunting and haunted, *Traces of Kara* is a chilling suspense with great characters, great locations, and a made-for-TV plotline that's sure to intrigue.

I first became acquainted with Melissa Foster's writing when I won a copy of her book, *Chasing Amanda*. I read that book and loved it, so when the opportunity came to read this book and review it, I grabbed it!

As other reviewers have stated, I had trouble putting this one down, and even when I had to, I found myself still thinking about it and wondering what was going to happen next. Melissa's writing just has a way of doing that to a person. It was one of the things I liked so much about *Chasing Amanda*.

So why did I give this four stars instead of five? Well, here are a few reasons.

- 1) The action is fast-paced, but it might have been a little too fast-paced for me. I found myself getting lost sometimes and having to go back and reread some things just to get clear on them.
- 2) The scene changes weren't chronological. Sometimes, when a scene changed, you would actually go slightly back in time, which made me wonder how far back in time the action was taking place...Or maybe I was just over-thinking it.
- 3) All things considered, this was a really violent little book, and I'm not a big fan of violence. I mean, I

understood that it was necessary within the context of the book. It's just not really my "cup of tea", and I found myself wishing that there wasn't so much of it. Chasing Amanda, by contrast, was a much sweeter, tamer book... Well, in a sense, anyway.

4) At least one of the plot points felt unresolved. Did Marissa's dad leave because he wanted to escape her mom, or did he leave to be there for Roland and protect Marissa? I don't suppose it's all that important, but both possibilities came up within the course of the story, so it's one of those things that nagged at me (and still does).

All in all, though, this is another great book from someone who is quickly becoming one of my favorite authors. If you like Lifetime movies (I happen to be one of those people who do) and don't mind a little added violence, you'll love this book. Why not give it a try?

The book starts off by introducing us to Kara and Roland, two seemingly unconnected people residing miles apart from each other. Kara, recovering from the ordeal of divorce, is planning to join Nursing school. Things are complicated as her mother doesn't really understand her decisions and wants her to get back with her ex-husband. Roland on the other hand, is a disfigured man with a past. His is being closely watched by the local police even though he hasn't toed the line in some time now. But little do they know that he is biding his time and planning his way to be reunited with his sister. As the story progresses we find out surprising connections and history between the two protagonists. Past revisited and secrets are revealed.

When I read Chasing Amanda by the same author, I felt like a third person watching the whole story play out as I couldn't really connect with the characters.
