Oh my. This book almost made me swear off reading murder mysteries forever. It was so unbelievably cheesy, but with this title, why wasn't I surprised? By the second chapter, I was wondering why the main character, who's a vet, feels obligated to her friend to solve another friend's murder. Maybe if I'd read the preceding books in the series, I would know the answer to this question, but that turned me off the main character immediately, and the plot was just too ridiculous for me to get over. Cynthia Baxter once again delivers a very well written mystery with enough red herrings, colorful characters, and supprises to keep the reader eagerly turning the pages with anticipation. This time, Jessica's small role in a local theater production is her cover to investigate a Long Island playwright's murder. Even for those who aren't necessarily theater buffs, this was a neat look inside a local theater's production. I thoroughly enjoyed it!

I've read the five previous books in this series, and recommend it -- especially for pet lovers. Jessica's visits to treat pets in her mobile pet clinic always make me smile ... I love the animals and like reading about their various health issues and how they are treated.
