Ed and Al also reach north to Fort Briggs where they met Olivier Mira Armstrong. Briggs motto is survival of the fittest. While there a new homunculi appears, Sloth, who is digging an underground tunnel.

May explains Xing alchemy to Marcoh

A set of scary eyes appear on the tunnel, is it father or another homunculi.

A general from central arrives, tries to recruit Olivier Armstrong so she lets Sloth back to dig. She agrees but then kills him.

Winry arrives to Briggs to be used by Kimblee as hostage.

Hawkeye learns Selim is an homunculus.

Kimblee recruits Ed to capture Scar, while looking for him in a nearby town they split and find Scar first, along with Marcoh and May they create a plan to escape Kimblee's watch, Scar fakes kidnapping Winry.

Unfortunately after that news comes Armstrong was sent to central and Fort Briggs is no longer safe. Al goes out to warn them and faints.

Interesting book, we get to see how Bradley keeps control of Mustang but they still manage to investigate and communicate.

The travel to Briggs at first seemed like a filler new site to send the Elric brothers, but turned out to add some new homunculi and story development, specially about military conspiracy.

And what a cliche, Al fainting, his soul abandoning the armor is scary.
