I agree with both reviews. The bright pictures and interactive flaps are engaging and students could get to know what to expect after rereading it, as Casselli explained. I agree with both reviews that it forces children to interact with the book, and would be helpful with kids who are not a fan of reading.

Evaluation of Literary Elements:

This book's illustrations are very colorful and bright, drawing in children's attention and making them cheery, as Molly Bang's book described. The drawings are simple and realistic, as to give children a real look at what an airport is really like. This book is interactive, lifting the flaps makes children predict what is under them and gets them engaged in the book.

Consideration of Instructional Application:

I could use this book for fine motor skill development. I could also have the kids create their own lift the flap book- teaching them to cut, paste, draw, etc. This would foster creativity and teach them fine motor skills.
