One thing I really didn't like is how the word "mate" is used in this series; I'm never sure if they mean mates like all other shifter stories do (for life, bonded) or just boyfriends. In the first book, Paxton even says that Lucas has had "mates" before and they never worked out. In this book Henry is finally moving in with Paxton after six months as "mates".

The other thing that kept me from liking the book more is something that was a problem with the first one as well. There's this big buildup, big stuff goes down, and yet there seems to be a lot left unresolved. I assumed that the questions left from the first book would be answered here but that didn't really seem to be the case.

So I would read another one or something else by this author but this won't be one of my re-reads.

There is nothing exactly "wrong" in this light (very, very light) work, beside a couple of typos. The problem is that every situation and every feeling are explained as if the readers were too unexperienced to understand the implications of every simple exchange.
