Holy Sh*t! This wrecked me ! It was so much MORE than I expected and I expect A LOT from Julie as she's one of my ultimate favourite authors.

While this is a standalone, a spin off from Three, Two, One, this was also an ending to a phenomenal ride

with all those connected to the Company. Don't get me wrong, you can read this without having read anything else from Julie and if you do, and really like this one, I strongly suggest going back to the beginning (see reading order below) and savour every delicious minute of this FUBAR mind bending story!

This is Sasha Aston's (nee Cherlin) story. It was as much about her past as it was about her future.

“I was never Sash Aston. She doesn’t exist. I was born, and have always been, Sasha Cherlin. Company kid. Daughter to a traitor. Child assassin.”

Sasha is desperately seeking a new life, a "normal" life and yet she's not really living or participating in life. Something or someone - Nicholas Tate - is holding her back.

“I feel like he is the last piece of the puzzle that is me. The one thing in my past that is unresolved.”

For me, this was an unassuming read. I was reading along tickety-boo and then BAM! I started to unravel. As Sasha struggled with who she was, her past and that 12 year old girl with her love of dinosaurs and all the loss she endured and what she had to do came flooding back...and this only intensified as she continued on her collision course with Nick.

Nick was such a big character and yet so dark and illusive throughout the Company adventure. We only saw snippets of him throughout this journey and could only form an opinion about him based on the thoughts of others, especially Harper (his sister) and Sasha. Nick was all that I'd hoped he'd be. I was also thrilled to finally have his POV. Like Sasha, I couldn't help but fall for him. Thank you, Julie!

And Special Agent Jackson (Jax) Barlow...I liked him from the get go but I also feared for Sasha. I didn't know if I could trust him and his motives. But he quickly squashed my worries.

“I said you’re safe with me. I meant it. I’m not here to rip your world apart, Sasha. I’m here to put it back together.”

This links with 321, there's a cameo of Ark (his brother - aka Jake), as this story takes place along side that one. Seeing Jax with Sasha, his brother and also getting his POV, all equaled me loving Jax!

As this story unfolds, especially the last third of the book, had me going back and reading excerpts from other books as dots were connected and the larger picture was revealed. Julie really pulled together all the little details! This book had all of it coming together for me and I'm sure I missed some of it. And on top of all the feels, there was a moment...that I knew was coming...that just had my heart breaking even more for Sasha.

I also freakin' loved the cameo of some of Sasha's posse, especially James (yeah, I love that fuckin' maniac!).

Wasted Lust. Oh this book, it completely tore me up. When you read multiple books about characters you begin to feel like you know them. With that comes this protectiveness over them. *Wasted Lust* is the last book about *The Company*, Sasha Aston's story.

It has been ten years since Sasha last saw Nick Tate. Nick was her childhood love, her promise. While logically most girls would shun an arranged married, Sasha embraced her arrangement with Nick. She is Company kid, it's what she knows. Even years later she still longs for Nick to return to her.

Jax is an FBI Agent assigned to monitor Sasha. When the story begins Sasha and Jax are meeting for the first time. He is an elite agent trust with the task of bringing Nick in. His job to monitor the bait, Sasha. Jax is studied, prepared and completely invested, but when he sees Sasha in real life his world stops. He knows it's wrong, forbidden, but he wants her.

Sasha is crazy independent and regardless of what Nick does or did, she is loyal. She won't hurt him or help capture him. The story progresses over several months. Months of Jax watching, Sasha living the life she is supposed to have, and Nick unseen.

Julie builds the story at a cruise. In the beginning, I am on the edge of my seating waiting to see what happens. By the time I am comfortable the whole story flips and begins flying. It was the Julie I am used to, the story teller who says to hell with it all and goes balls the wall. Sasha's story is thrilling, heartbreaking and of course sexy as sin.

I'm a little late to the writings of JA Huss, especially to this series. I started this series with 321 and then went to Meet Me in the Dark and now Wasted Lust. Not being privy to the prior books, I was a little concerned at the beginning. Sasha Aston/Cherlin has been around for a long time and she has a lot of history with this series. There were times when I was thinking that I could not relate but just as that thought came to me, JA Huss read my mind and supplied information to make me at ease. The more I read, the more absorbed I became with the story. The background and needed information for the story was given in bits and pieces that made the story suspenseful, engaging, dark, menacing, and twisted. But what I most felt with this book was a deep and dark sense of wanting and needing love. This book kept me reading when I should have been doing other things, I couldn't put it down. It captivated me!!

Sasha and Agent Jax are two people with many secrets. One so lost in her secrets that she is nothing but a shell living her life. The other is obsessed with avenging a wrong. But their secrets tie them together in a profound way. As they begin to trust one another and divulge their secrets, their connection becomes emotional, sensual and REAL. The twists and turns within the book turn the tides back and forth but Jax and his feelings for Sasha never waiver. So clearly, it was happening. We all saw that, right? The second Sasha wrote that note to Rook it was on.

But whatever. I could wait until the writer agreed with me. By wait, I mean carry on as if it were happening.

"Jana, why did a book called Sasha just show up on my 2015 calendar?"

"What? That's a year from now. That's more than enough time for you to finish up Ford, Spencer and write an entire series on whomever the fuck James is."

"I'm deleting this Jana."

Jesus. You try and organize a person.

Then Come Back released and Sasha killed it. Killed. It.

This girl, she steals every scene along with your heart. Her book has to happen. I have to know what kind of woman this brave, mouthy child grows into.

"Julie, Come Back was incredible."

"I loved it too. I think it's one of my favorites."

"Yeah. I can't wait until Sasha grows up and meets a CEO."

"There's no CEO, Jana."

So it didn't happen overnight. I had to wait some. And then wait some more. Julie had other books to write, and Sasha had to grow up. But finally, all my delusional wishing came true. Julie was writing Sasha.

"Squeee! All the squeees! Is Rory there? And Five? I cannot wait for Rory & Five's book. I put that on your calendar for 2016 by the way."

"Rory's at the party. Five's missing it because the Aston's are out of town. But don't worry, all the Shrike sisters are at the party."

"Sisters? OMG. There's more?"

It was like Christmas, summer vacation and my cat wearing a unicorn hat all rolled up into one. But wait.

Could I get one more delusional wish?

“You know, Julie. Rory could be short for Aurora. Aurora is the first Disney princess.”

“Are you drunk?” Julie asked.

“Ronnie would name her daughters after Disney princesses. Aurora, Belle, Ariel and Jasmine Shrike. Ronnie would so do that!”

“LOL.”

“Why are you LOL’ing me? I’ve never been more serious.”

Then Julie said something even crazier than the delusional happenings in my head.

“I hope you like Wasted Lust,” she said.

Like it? I liked it before she even agreed to write it. I gobbled up every delicious word of Wasted Lust. Wasted Lust is a standalone book that takes place a decade after both the Rook & Ronin, and Dirty, Dark & Deadly series. Sasha appears in those series as a child. This book runs parallel to 321 with a spoiler free crossover between books.

Wasted Lust might end up being one of the hardest reviews I’ve had to write. I want to just cut open myself open and let all my emotions just spill out. So this might be one of those reviews. The kind that will make no sense until you read the book and understand the way a heart can break and heal and hope all at the same time.

We met Sasha Cherlin as a twelve year old girl in Slack. We saw her go from child to killer in Come Back and Coming For You and now in Wasted Lust we see Sasha Aston grow into a woman.

Special Agent Jax Barlow has been searching for the key to unlock the mystery of the Company and it isn’t until Sasha falls into his lap that the answers are within reach. But Sasha is trying to be normal, it’s been ten years since her, James, Harper, Merc and Nick sent the Company spiraling out of control. Ten years to

become a member of society and not just a child assassin. Ten years to get over the broken heart of her broken promise.

But if the rumors are true, Nick Tate is returning to the states. Returning for what is the question that everyone wants to know, but only Nick holds the answer to. Jax wants information and he wants vengeance but he might find himself wanting something so much more before it's all said and done.

Let me touch on the sexy times a bit. At first I was a little worried about a grown up Sasha having sex. I imagined Ford busting in to ruin the moment every time. I mean, we've loved this girl for years. Since she was little. But holy smokes. Let's just say Sasha is all grown up. But what I loved most was that the sex in this was part of two characters progression through this story. It was not too subtle, it was not overdone. It was just right. There were far too many things going on in this story to make it too heavy on the sex.

This story was all about the emotions. I bawled. I cried like a baby. I've read this two times already and I still can't stop thinking about it. There are key scenes in this book that I can't even think about without crying, scenes that will remain with me for years to come. The epilogue. I died. All the deads.

I spent the weeks leading up to this release rereading all twelve books in this journey. So much was fresh in my mind. So many characters that I loved. I wanted to be prepared to read *Wasted Lust*. I needed to be up to speed. I needed to have all the information fresh in my head so I didn't have to pause during reading this. I think doing that turned this conclusion into an epic experience.

There is no doubt that JA Huss writes stories that are twisty, dark and yet, still remain romances – but *Wasted Lust* was all of that but more. *Wasted Lust* was that climatic moment where everything that had happened gets closure. We get closure. We get answers to all the questions we had. We get our hope restored. We get our hearts healed although we got it smashed just moments before.

321 had become my favorite Huss book earlier this year and I am on the fence right now because *Wasted Lust* I think just nudged it out of first place. I think the fact that this book was the conclusion of the whole Company Saga gives it an advantage because the emotions were already there for all these characters. There was no need to find a connection, it had been forged long ago.

After finishing this book I can't help but have hope. Just hope. Not quite sure yet what that hope is for, but it's just this feeling like it can all be OK. Even if it's not right now. It will be OK. I love that this book reached inside and affected me. I love that even thinking about this story right now has me choked up all over again – because that is what it is all about. Feeling. Julie makes you feel and that is the best gift an author can give you.

Wasted Lust delivered in every way imaginable. A little girl with braces who loved dinosaurs stole my heart and as a grown woman, she amazed me. Nick Tate was a character that was cloaked in so much mystery. We saw him through Harper's eyes and through Sasha's eyes... but we never really got to see him through his own until now. And wow. I loved what I saw. Jax... Oh. Jax. I claimed Jax a while back. I'd like state for the record I claimed him first – there is evidence of this online. I can show it to you. He was everything I needed

him to be. He was EVERYTHING. (and MINE)

If you have not read books by this author you are missing out. Like, your life is missing something. I've included the reading order below and highly recommend starting from Tragic and reading all the books in order – you get the clearest picture that way.

For fans of Julie, who have read all these books there is no doubt that this is going to be loved. There is no way not to love this book if you've known all the players all this time. And although the books really only span 2 years in reality and more like 12 years in the book world, it feels like I've spent a decade with them, not just 2 years.

Wasted Lust is one of my most highly anticipated new releases this summer. If you've read all (or most) of JA Huss's books, you met Sasha Cherlin a while ago. If you're like me, this little girl stole your heart in Ford's novella. Then this amazing assassin smurf stole the show in her *Dirty, Dark, and Deadly* series. So now we have Sasha, all grown up. Yes, that little girl is now 24 years old and this is her story.

Sasha is a grad student. She works hard, studies hard, but isn't really living. Then she meets Jax Barlow (you might recognize Jax as Ark's brother from 321 ;)) who is out for the truth. He's trying to get justice and he needs Sasha's help. Sasha is no longer a Company kid. She's an adult trying to live a normal life. But when Jax brings Nick Tate's name up, he has her attention.

Nick Tate was Sasha's promise. Nick has been out of the country for a while now. Sasha is hesitant to help Jax. Especially if it has to do with Nick. Nick was her friend, but he was more than that. No matter what he's done or what choices he's made, Sasha still wants to protect him. To save him. It's just who she is.

It takes a while for Jax to really get Sasha to open up. To feel safe with him. It's not an easy feat. This girl is tough as nails. But eventually, he starts to break through.

"I said you're safe with me. I meant it. I'm not here to rip your world apart, Sasha. I'm here to put it back together."

Sasha is one of my favorite characters out of any Huss book. There is just something about this girl, her strength, determination and feisty attitude I love. She hasn't had an easy life, but she's had it better than most Company girls. She knows this and does what she can to put things right. I love that she met Jax, someone who compliments her, accepts her for who she is and genuinely wants to help her and be there for her. (view spoiler)

The best part about this (and any Huss book) is that you never know what's coming next. Never know what to expect. I love that I was surprised with the direction this story took, especially towards the end. It's like the Company- nothing is what it seems.

Here's something you need to understand. Nothing is ever what it seems with these people, OK? Nothing.

The last half of this book takes the reader on a crazy ride. The last 30% or so was completely epic. Everything came full circle. The end hit me so hard I cried. Not only did the story bring me to tears, but the fact that I'm saying good bye to some of my favorite characters I've felt attached to for so long.

Wasted Lust can be read as a stand-alone. It's considered a 321 spin off. I personally feel like you would get more out of it having read Slack/Taut, the DDD series and 321. Only because you'll have more Company background and have more of a connection to the characters. Plus, they're wicked awesome reads.
