I've been a fan of Barbara's contemporary stories since picking up *Far from Perfect* (her *Perfect, Indiana* series) shortly after it was published. She's an amazing crafter of characters and plots that reach in and grip your heart, and *What Matters Most*, the story of Josey Haney, is every bit as good a story as I've come to expect from her.

Josey is a master plumber who has all but given up hope of finding a man who isn't intimidated by her. Will is an incredibly wealthy, successful lawyer whose life is not fulfilling. Both are extremely lonely. Thanks to a clogged drain they meet, and the attraction is instantaneous, but they seem to be worlds apart. Josey is terrified; what if Will turns out to be like all those other men? She likes him, he'll hurt her – maybe she shouldn't take a chance.

Of course, there are plot complications and twists galore, and we see plenty of Josey's brothers Sam and Wyatt, as well as their partners. We met all of them in the preceding two books, and while *What Matters Most* can be read as a standalone, I do suggest readers start with *What You Do to Me* (Haney's Book 1) – this is a fun family to visit with, it's better to get the full opportunity. We see their silliness, as well as their willingness to uplift Josey or call her on her mistakes when it's necessary. Overall, we experience the abiding love the Haney family members have for each other, and we understand why Josey is feeling a bit desperate to start her own family, to share that special closeness with someone. I don't think you can praise an author more than to say you were completely absorbed in the world she created, felt sad during the characters' bad times and wanted to shake sense into them. In this well written contemporary romance, the reader is drawn immediately into the story and is carried on a wave of romance all the way through to the end. Although What Matters Most is part of a larger series, you do not have to read the first two books to enjoy this one – it features characters from the previous books, but it also completely stands alone.

After really loving the first two books in this series, I was really looking forward to reading Josey's story, and Ms. Longley didn't disappoint. Josey was every bit the tough and incredibly capable woman that I wanted her to be, but we also got to see her softer, more vulnerable side which made her such a beautifully rounded character. As a lawyer who had always had money, Will's white collar existence was the total opposite of Jo's working class lifestyle, but I loved that he never once judged her as 'less than' or beneath him, but instead he saw and admired Jo for the skilled, fantastic woman that she is. Another thing that I loved was seeing the progression of the lives of Sam and Wyatt and the way that the other Haney's were such a big part of Jo's life. The scenes with her grandparents made my chest tighten with envy, Brady was absolutely adorable, and Jerry was wonderful, as always. All of the people Jo loves were a big part of this book (because the Haney's are a packaged deal) but they don't overwhelm it, it's the perfect balance.

She is extremely good at her job, but ... she is quite lonely now that her two brothers have settled down with their own families. She goes out on a job to fix a blocked bathroom sink for lawyer William Prescott. He lives in a very upmarket house, and she imagines him as a rich old man with a posh luxury car and a young trophy wife. She is dumbfounded when he turns out to be a gorgeous man, not very much older than her. He is extremely taken with her, and they seem to get on well. He is also extremely lonely, he has put his life and soul into a job that is making him unhappy, he works extremely long hours and has pretty much given up all hope of a social life.

They life views fit together well, and they finally get round to dating. They are deliriously happy but the day comes when a particularly gruelling event causes Josey to run away from him, and break up with him by email, rather than speak to him again.
