Loved the idea, but not a fan of the execution. If PMS were in the form of a novel, it'd be this book. If someone isn't sad, they're angry. If they're not angry, they're horny for sex. I don't think I ever felt a moment of calm as I read the story so I'm currently recovering from overuse of emotions.

I was pissed off with almost every character in the book. The only people who I wasn't mad at were Payton, Dean, and John and that's because they were barely in there (compared to the others). I was frustrated with Dash because of her temper and immature stubbornness. She also annoyed me. One example would be when

she was angry about making the bet with Slade and losing. I know what she means when she said pride wouldn't let her back out and yadda yadda, but don't whine about it so much when deep down inside there's a part of you that does want him to be closer to you. Every time where I felt she was redeemed in my favor, I hate her again. One example would be when she admitted to giving up her dream because she couldn't bear to be away from Slade after the accident. I loved her for that until later she admits she doesn't want to do it because she's scared of being in an accident herself. DON'T GET ME WRONG, I don't blame her for being scared because of that (god knows there were times where I was too scared to go back into the pool after drowning), but since she didn't bring back that she didn't want to leave Slade, it made it her seem a tiny bit self-centered. I also hated her for breaking Lucas' heart. Yes, Lucas is partly to blame since she did tell him a few times it was strictly friendship, but she wasn't reinforcing it as much as she should have with certain actions like when he kissed her on the forehead. Yes friends can do that, but if you really want to reiterate to your friend that you don't want anything more than friendship, then you shouldn't let the guy who's lovesick over you to do that.

I had a love/hate relationship with Slade. Douche bag in the beginning, a hero when he took the fall for her dad, then just plain WTF when he immediately seduces her after confessing the horrifying truth about what really happened in the accident, then some love/hate when he'd switch from being a romantic to a guy with a temper. Also, I felt like the a few of the sex scenes were thrown in at the wrong time (one obviously right after that confession about Dash's mother's death and another being).

The only time I hated Lucas (which was very small) was when he threw the first punch in his fight with Slade. Lucas has been a sweetheart throughout the entire book and suddenly he starts the fight? Slade I would expect it from, but not Lucas. With his character, I think it would've been more believable if Lucas stuck to spitting words of anger and having Slade throw the punch. I also thought it was a bit cliché/cheesy to have guys fighting over the lead girl, but I guess you can't always avoid it in romance novels. And as for Michael and Dash's dad, it's pretty obvious why I hate both (or at least why I hated Dash's dad in the beginning) so I won't go into explanation about them.

Also, one line struck me as strange.

He's an Asian doctor, but he has a kind face."

What exactly is that but for? Is there some asian stereotype that I'm unaware of? Is it that Asians have stoic faces or something? I believe it wasn't intended to be offended, but it did strike a tiny nerve when I read that sentence. While I was a tiny bit butt hurt about it, I'm just mostly curious as to the purpose of this sentence.

In general, This book was just lacking in character likability and lack of connection to the plot (which could be fixed if the book was longer/some scenes were expanded). I'm sorry if I sound like a snob/bitch (which I'm sure I do), but this book just wasn't for me. I do hope the author does continue writing books though because this story wasn't hopeless, it did have some moments where I was enraptured in the story.
