I am a fan of Jessica Sorensen. If you've followed our blog anytime in the last year- you would know that because I have read and reviewed almost everything she has written. And everything has blown me away. Jessica does not skimp on emotion. She forces you to feel EVERYTHING on every page. I mean everything. You are going to be sad, happy, depressed, enraged. You'll feel pity for characters, sympathy for them and when something good happens- you'll cheer them on. In a nutshell- this will be you:

The thing about Jessica's writing is the way in which things are emotional. Her characters suffer SO MUCH. The Certainty of Violet and Luke is book 3 in their story. In the first book you meet the two on a deeper level after having met them on the surface in Callie and Kayden's story. What you see are two people who have had shit lives handed to them and who are basically emotionally stunted as a result and they find some camaraderie in one another. In the second book- we see Luke falling apart and Violet saving him until the end of the book when all of the shit just hits the fan.

And that brings us to book 3. This book. Jesus Christ Almighty. This book. It's Luke's turn to be there for Violet. Lovers- LUKE IS EVERYTHING. I have swooned over a lot of book boyfriends in my life. I am here to tell you that Luke just destroyed me for men. The love that pours out of this man. I can't. Cannot. Can't.

Ich liebe die Teile rund um Callie & Kayden und daher war für mich klar, dass auch Violet & Luke gelesen werden müssen. Leider konnten mich die beiden bisher nur bedingt überzeugen, aber mit diesem Band bin ich wieder versöhnlicher gestimmt. Ab hier gibt es leider Spoiler für die Vorbände, also aufpassen: Die Handlung geht ca. 2 Wochen nach dem Ende vom vorigen Teil weiter und die beiden sind wieder zurück von ihrem Kurztrip nach Las Vegas, was mir gut gefallen hat. Dort mochte ich die Stimmung nämlich nicht besonders. Luke geht wieder regelmäßig zur Uni und versucht alles, um es Violet so angenehm wie möglich zu machen und sich sicher zu fühlen. Violet hingegen ist erneut an einem ziemlichem Tiefpunkt angekommen, nachdem sie erfahren hat, wer Preston wirklich ist und in welcher Verbindung er zu ihrer Vergangenheit steht, auch wenn noch nicht alles geklärt ist, was aber in Verlauf des Buches noch passiert, was ich gut fand. Manchmal enden ja nicht alle Bücher gänzlich geklärt, aber hier war es wirklich gut, dass alle Fragen beantwortet wurden und man zufrieden mit dem Buch enden konnte.

Zugegeben, es war aber ein langer Weg bis dorthin, denn gerade Violet hat mit sich und der ganzen Situation rund um den Tod ihrer Eltern noch zu knabbern, und die Sache mit dem Stalker macht es für sie auch nicht leichter. Aber dafür ist ihr Luke eine riesige Stütze, auch wenn es für ihn ebenfalls nicht so leicht ist, dennoch ist er ihr Fels in der Brandung, unerschütterlich und einfach nur großartig. <3

Ich fand Luke toll und ich mag ihn fast genauso sehr wie Kayden, weshalb ich ihm und seiner Liebe zu Violet auch alles Gute und mir ein Happy End gewünscht habe. Er wirkt zwar nach außen hin etwas unnahbar und hart, ist aber ein Softie im Herzen, was ich besonders süß fand. Manchmal ist er fast schon kitschig, aber darüber beschwere ich mich jetzt nicht.

Nur Violet war mir an manchen Stellen zu anstrengend mit ihrer negativen, depressiven, nicht-wahr-haben-wollenden-Art, was mir leider etwas vom Lesespaß genommen hat, auch wenn sie ein dickes Päckchen zu tragen hatte. Auch hätte ich mir mehr Nebendynamik von Kayden und Callie gewünscht, aber die zwei kamen nur ganz am Rande vor.

Wie immer war der Schreibstil ohne viele Schnörkel, sondern eher brutal und direkt mit vielen Flüchen,

sowie in der Gegenwart und ich der Ich-Form geschrieben, weshalb man quasi durch das Buch rasen kann, so schnell ist es zu lesen. ^^ Was ich nicht störend finde, sondern zu den Charakteren und auch zu dem Genre passt.

Und das Ende war sowieso total nach meinem Geschmack, obwohl ich nach diesen emotionalen drei Bänden rund um Violet & Luke schon fast nicht mehr damit gerechnet habe.
