It revolves around a Tattoo shop, a gym and a great bunch of guys! The timid Tattoo artist, Oliver Vos and The Compassionate Strongman, Dagen Rourke. Along with Dagen's 3 spirited brothers, Vidar, Magnus and Harbor.....(All of which will be getting their own books! Woo hoo!)

Dagen is the gentlest, yet biggest one of the bunch. He is recovering from an injury and trying to make a name for himself in the Strongman competition world. This gentle giant prefers the solidarity of his home curled up with a good book rather than going to loud clubs. (He is the sweetest!) When he gets an impromptu roommate, he is not pleased, that is until he meets the gorgeous, but troubled Tattoo artist, Oliver ... His physical attraction is evident, although the man is skiddish and closed off. Dagen becomes even more invested and protective of Ollie when he gets some information into his past.... Ollie is running from that past in search of a new beginning. He has major trust issues, but patient and oh so sweet Dagen is slowly knocking down his walls.

I loved these boys. Their relationship took it's time developing by building trust. Becoming friends first, while hiding their obvious connection....

3.5 stars rounded up because frankly, I don't tend to expect much from novellas by new-to-me authors. And frankly, I was pleasantly surprised here! *Carry and Drag* may be a novella, but it is a **well-written one, with an engaging premise and well-crafted characters.**

Gifted tattoo artist **Ollie** needs a fresh start. He gets one in the form of a new job and a new roommate, **Dagen**. An aspiring strongman who epitomizes "gentle giant", Dagen wants Ollie. More than that, he wants to care for Ollie. Ollie doesn't think that he wants that. That he *can't* want that. But his walls begin to crumble in Dagen's soft and steadfast presence.

Their relationship is a **sweet slow burn** from roommates to friends to lovers. Given Ollie's past, it had the potential to devolve into angst.com. Instead, they trusted and communicated with one another.

The novella occasionally suffered from **series opener syndrome**, with new characters introduced and new relationships teased. It wasn't always easy to keep things straight. There is a muted suspense element that flirts with melodramatic but doesn't cross the line. The editing could have been tighter, and the pacing wasn't always on point. But since this appears to be one of Frost's first published works, I anticipate that she will improve upon these issues.

The ending is a HFN, which I can live with since we will surely see more of Ollie and Dagen (and their inevitable HEA, right? ?) In the meantime, I look forward to additional stories. I would l-o-v-e a story for Kayla, seeing as female fighters are all too rare as romance novel heroines, and I would like to learn more about Harbor (and yes, I am still wrapping my brain around some of these names). To be honest, I wasn't feeling Vidar and Niko; it seemed forced, and Niko was too young. And if we learn that (view spoiler)

Carry and Drag was a **sexy, fun, and quick** read - if you're looking for that, pick this up.

Carry and Drag is the story of Dagen, a weightlifter who just recovered from an injury and is now training for his next competition, keen to win to contribute to the family business and prove himself to his brothers, and Ollie, a tattoo artist who wants to start over new and is waiting for the other shoe to drop as the opportunity he's been given just seems too good to be true.

I liked all aspects of the book:
