EDIT TO ORIGINAL REVIEW

This is a paranormal young adult book, and I do think that it would be enjoyed more by the younger end of the young adult spectrum. There is very little kissing, and not really any touching at all. There is a lot of melodrama that seems to be a requirement of anything written for younger people, and for the most part, the situations they find themselves in are reminiscent of high school. Not to mention that Shayne IS in high school. Sometimes the feel of the characters is more mature, but I felt like Shayna was on par with her age group.

I'm not sure how to write a review without giving any spoilers and not sound trite. The reader really isn't given any inkling of what sort of PNR this is until about a third of the way through. It's a fairly fresh idea but with well used elements. The paranormal aspect isn't new, but the way its put together made me wonder what was coming next. The ever present teen love triangle....aaaah! It's here! It's here! Thank goodness I love love triangles. There's just something about the idea of having two hotties fighting over me (err, the heroine) that makes me feel all girly.

One thing that bothered me was how there just wasn't much description. Example: during one scene, Shayna is on horseback and is nearly accosted by a "bad guy". She runs through the forest andgoes home. What? No leaves slashing at her face or adrenaline pumping through her veins? No chase scene? I just didn't get the feeling that I was a *part* of the story. The thing I love about books vs movies is that you are inside the characters head instead of watching from afar. I just never connected with Shayna in that way. There wasn't much inner dialogue. I was always being *told* what she was feeling instead of feeling it myself.

I'll say that I wasn't nearly as confused during my second go round with this book. There has been some editing done. I would say that if you are someone who hiccups whenever you see misspelled or misused word...the book is still full of them. But it was definitely smoother this time.

ORIGINAL REVIEW 8-19-2012

I would absolutely love to read this book when it has been thoroughly edited. At the very least, read over by a good friend or some beta readers and changed. The story itself is great and exciting...at first I got little butterflies of anticipation, but then I just got confused.

First off, the point of view often changes without notice. The story starts off being told in third person, and then it randomly switches to some sort of narrative, present tense thing. Often in the middle of a paragraph, with no paragraph breaks.

There were numerous spelling mistakes, and weird errors such as using 'incent' instead of incense. It's used correctly a couple of pages later, and even my spell check picks up on the error. I'm not sure how things like that get overlooked. There are commas instead of periods, periods instead of commas, a noticeable lack of quotation marks...you get the point.

I am usually not one to care if an indie author's book is poorly edited. In fact, I've gotten into some verbal spats with some Good Reads readers who bash indie authors because of a lack of editing. I think the story is often enough to let me overlook a few run on sentences. But I found it hard to even follow the story line in this book. What I DID follow was very good, and I like I said in the beginning, I would LOVE to finish this after it has some major editing work done. I would also LOVE to change my review and rating. I think that when this has a little more time spent on it, it could be a fabulous addition the the YA paranormal cache. As it is, I don't feel like I am getting anything out of it other than frustrated.

I am surprised by all the high ratings for this book. I have to admit it gives a new edge to the vampire story but overall I didn't find anything extraordinary here. For me it reads like *Fallen* and *Hush*, *Hush* - but since there are so many people love them, it may be just me.

This book has everything I hate in a YA novel - insta-love, unnecessary love triangle (rectangle? pentagon?), characters without personality and a totally predictable ending. I had wanted to read more about Shayna's and Melina's relationship and less about how Shayna is sooo different from everyone. I didn't understand Cain and Shayna's relationship very well and (view spoiler) Also Aiden's role in the entire book was unclear.

This book needs a lot of editing. The narration frequently changes between past tense and present tense. There are also lots of grammatical and spelling errors. Words like 'there' and 'their', 'to' and 'too', 'you're' and 'your' have been frequently interchanged. The transition between scenes are not smooth. The dialogue between characters seems forced and unnatural. But what I disliked the most was that this book had a lot of potential which it didn't live up to. The characterization was also very poor. Shayna could have been a strong character but all I got was a girl who claimed at every point she was *different* and yet sounded a lot like every other whiny YA heroine whose life was fully codependent on her boyfriend and was ignoring the rest of the world because of it. I saw no place in the story for Melina and Noah, which kind of sucked.

This book was completely different from what I expected when I read the blurb. I don't think I will like this book even when it is thoroughly edited. It is just not my cup of tea.

Shayna has discovered a dark secret, she takes after her missing father, who was a special kind of vampire, a born vampire. When she turns eighteen, she will change and become immortal.

Meanwhile, a new boy comes to her school and is immediately on the 'must have' list for all of the girls, but Cain only has eyes for Shayna. He also has his own secrets that could end Shayna's existence, or break her heart. Their mutual attraction is intense, but Shayna is also 'stalked' by another being, Aiden, Cain's brother, who says he was sent to protect her from Cain.

Cain was very well-developed and very likeable, not so much with the other characters who seemed almost to be shadows of their potential. Shayna's character seemed weak and flimsy, while Aiden wreaked of evil. As book one in a new series, it was just okay, perhaps book two will step it up, now that the foundation has been laid.

I'll admit that when this YA paranormal romance was getting going I was quite shocked by the amount of similarities it had to the Twilight Saga, such as the female MC playing down her natural attractiveness and appeal and the male MC being unable to read her mind, despite the fact he could do it to everyone else.

However, this is more than a Twilight rehash, if you give it the proper time to unfold. It's got a strong plot that's as much as power struggle as it is a tug-of-love. And by the story ends you'll be surprised by all the twists and turns that have unfolded. And be left excited for the sequel to see what happens next.

I'm not sure I'd let my ten-year-old daughter read this, but I'd certainly be happy for a child of fourteen plus to read it. There's no gore and no sexual or horror orientated graphic scenes. The female MC presents a worthy role model and has good values and about retaining her virginity, with a storyline that doesn't lean too heavily on the pressure of temptation.

Although it's a coming of age story, it's paranormal storyline dispenses with all that teenage angst and stuff about fitting in because the female MC is such a strong character. And it's more satisfying to think of it as a journey about self discovery and learning who you are.
