Having been discovered in her latest theft, Viola's life is forever altered when a demon hunter, his apprentice, and the jail's lead interrogator take an interest in Viola and the possibilities that lie behind her unique physiology. Traveling as a team, the four are trying to escape an unbelievable threat to the world as they try to keep Viola safe.

The story was interesting, full of action, and developed rather well with an imaginative and complex world that was being built for the reader as the narrative progressed, maintaining reader engagement with the text. I was a little thrown at times by Viola's description - she's a 19 year old girl, who is innocent to much of what the world offers, but she was often referred to in ways that made her seem like a small child, which read as

and felt strange. The text could use some editing to clean up some grammatical issues that kept cropping up, most notably then/than issues, but it didn't detract too horribly from the story.

Overall, I'd give it a 3.5 out of 5 stars.
