No, this is not some elaborate set up for a flippant bar joke. It's the set up for this crazy-fun-tastic book!

What's not to love? This read was terrific! It was light, with a side of heavy; it was exciting and full of action. I loved the heroine, Rosemary, who's reaction to her situation was right one cue! Rosemary Fernandes is just getting started in the real estate business when she enters an empty house and encounters the ghost of Keith Laumer. It's written in first person narrative completely from Rosemary's point of view. Pros: The characterization in this book is well-done. It's easy to relate to Rosemary's uncertainty, both in her job and personal life, and also her strengths as she grows into her new job as a 'ghost whisperer' so to speak and a sleuth as she figures out what has happened to Keith.
