Whether you are a beginning tarot reader or a long-time reader of the cards, I would (without a shadow of a doubt) recommend you pick up this book.

You may not find yourself creating hundreds of spreads for the masses, but the information to be gained from Moore's writing is more than enough to make this purchase well worth it. She begins the book by explaining her stance on the benefits of tarot spreads alongside reading tarot cards. She discusses many ways to interpret the cards in correlation to tarot spreads, and even without the use of spreads. In addition to discussing the creation and reading of tarot spreads, she includes a wide variety of already created spreads for you to use. If I were to recommend any book to beginning tarot readers, this would be it.

There are so many resources on how to interpret the cards, but very few quality websites explaining tarot spreads fluently and accurately as Moore does.

Not only does Moore share several of her personal spreads, she explains how to create a spread (it's more than just plopping down some cards and assigning meanings) and how to modify spreads found in other sources. Things to consider when creating a spread include the visual shape of the pattern of cards (triangles provide more interplay than straight rows, straight rows suggest a time progression) and determining just how much info you want. As I'm fond of saying to my students: Don't use 10 cards if 5 will do; don't use 5 cards if you get your answer with 3.

With a title like *Tarot Spreads*, you expect to find a good selection of spreads in this book, and Barbara Moore does not disappoint. Quickly counting the index of spreads, I came up with 76 spreads, although some of them are variations of each other. But there are several books out there that list tarot spreads. Read this one if you're interested in what goes into the making of a spread. Moore devotes a chapter to discussing the design principles of effective spreads, showing that a spread is more than just the position descriptions, but also conveys meaning through how the cards are positioned. Other chapters walk you through modifying existing spreads to meet your needs and designing your own spreads from scratch. Moore also includes a chapter on techniques: things to do during readings to give you new perspectives on the cards, get unstuck during difficult readings, etc. This book does not talk about what the cards mean or the structure of a tarot deck, so it wouldn't work as someone's very first book about the tarot, but it's an excellent choice for someone who wants to learn more about spreads.

This is a great book on tarot. It offers insight into how spreads are designed and, more importantly, why. A lot of times it's easy to see why a given spread may have its shape. For example, if it's a spread about growth and the shape is that of a tree the relation between the two is evident. The Celtic Cross's shape may not be as immediately obvious. This book helps clarify how the shape of a spread can boost a reading and how different parts of a spread connect to each other.

While the main goal of this book is to go over spread design it covers other things such as spread techniques and how to alter a preexisting spread. This makes for some interesting reading and is very helpful, especially the latter. I think it's not an uncommon thing to find a spread that is good but not precisely what the reader is looking for. Being able to alter the spread accordingly is a useful thing to be able to do.

It also goes over some older ways of using tarot that aren't used as often nowadays. It's a nice bit of history and offers further insight into how tarot has developed.

Since everyone's philosophy on tarot is different it's not surprising that the author's views and my own don't always align perfectly. I didn't find this to be much of a problem though since the author acknowledges this in the book as opposed to trying to state "this is how tarot should be." It's nice to see other ways of looking at tarot and I think this book would be useful to anyone trying to gain insight into tarot spreads whether they want to create their own or not.
