This is a fun tarot deck. It is based on the Rider Waite deck and doesn't expound much beyond the basic symbolism of that deck. Crowley blathers on a great deal about the movement of the star based on writings be Eliphas Levi (From what I recall, it has been a few years), and how he and Lady Frieda Harris came up with the art.

Really the only value this deck has over others is if you believe Crowley's special brand of mystical nonsense. If you are not a Thelemite this is a convoluted version of Rider Waite deck with an even more convoluted guide. The sad fact is you need to study Crowley's Kabbalah and other writings to understand the symbolism of this book/cards...That value of that depending on weather not you agree with his critics that say his poor grasp of Hebrew made most of his writings on the subject questionable at best. (that is to say there are better experts on mythology and Kabbalah than Crowley, who was called the King of the Red-Herring for a reason.)

I am still divided on this one. I had this deck at one point as a baby-beginning tarot reader. The major arcana and the minor suits are regular with just a few logical, enough easy-to-understand deviations in the MA. This is always a plus for me because ideally, I love the ease of readily and ably using ALL my tarot decks without learning a massive new system, even though it is a collection.

I remember looking at the piccies a lot, they are gracefully beautiful, colorful, I related to some of the symbology fairly well and there were a lot of new symbols to pique the imagination. The main problem I had was technical: is it an oversize deck, unwieldy to shuffle and use, and the cards were very 'slippery' even when broken in, so I didn't reach for it much when I wanted to read. I eventually passed it to a friend who admired it and wanted to frame some of the pix. I would probably be more attracted personally to it now and the special added symbols would be more meaningful to me now that I have studied a bit more in wider magickal disciplines, know a little more about Kabbalah and have a better grounding in Crowley's time period. It is a unique and outstanding deck and very worth a potential look for quite a few reasons. It seems to be one of those love-it-or-hate-it decks but I remain on the fence. Note: get the edition that has the extra Magus cards if you collect, they are pretty :D
