Expectations are high in the second installment of the Empath Trilogy and HK Savage delivered. The roller coaster starts out slow but quickly escalates with action full of twists and turns. All the while, characters are falling in love, giving up on love, and being betrayed by love. Throughout it all we are introduced to new powers, new characters, and new beings in this mythology. It's difficult to keep it all straight. So much has happened!

This book is violent enough that I would not recommend it for younger audiences. Yet, it is not violent enough to be written off by those with weaker stomachs or those adverse to gory scenes. It's a good balance to have these events in written form without it being over-the-top. Romance and action is always a great combination. Throw in some mysterious supernatural elements and it's gold.

I loved watching Claire become powerful in her own right. She's a grown up with abilities and she's using them. No helpless little girl here. What I liked:
