Getting Dirty with the CEO is the third book in the adult contemporary romance series, called The Suits Undone series, by author Mia Sosa. This was a fun, quick read. Each of the books works well as a standalone. In fact, I didn't even know that this book was the third book in the series until I had finished it and was drafting my review post. I had absolutely no issues following the storyline and the character. I am excited, now that I get to read books 1 and 2 because this one was a lot of fun. If you are a fan of some great bickering and resisting, this is going to be a hit with you.

Getting Dirty with the CEO is told in dual narrative between the two main characters, Mimi and Daniel. The story starts out at a wedding (which, now that I am thinking about it, was probably the wedding of one of the couples from book 1 or 2.) and Daniel and Mimi have an almost- hook up. Then the book flashes forward to four months later and the real story takes off from there. At a bachelor charity auction in fact. Dude, Mia Sosa writes the most realistic romances. I can't even explain it, but when I'm reading her stories I always feel like that could be my love story, or something that happened with a friend or someone I know.

As the story opens, Daniel is attending a wedding and since I didn't read the first book in the series, it threw me off for a moment but this book does stand alone so it wasn't a problem in the end. Daniel has built a successful business which has been propelled by his charm, sophistication and charisma. He also has a reputation for being a player, and all of these things are major strikes against him with the bride's best friend Mimi. She is a spitfire whose strength, determination and spirit have intrigued him, and the nickname he gave her fits well: Fireworks.

Mimi certainly lives up to her nickname in the opening chapter as they verbally spar, and the chemistry between them is undeniable. But just when she thinks she has the upper hand, Daniel shocks her by calling a halt to the festivities. Despite his reputation, he wants to be more than a conquest or a one night stand to her, and although he is going to have his work cut out for him, he knows the effort will be worth it.

Daniel may be successful and charismatic, but he is nothing like Mimi's philandering and obnoxious father who has contributed to her toxic outlook on men and relationships. After watching her mother fade into a shell of herself with no means to support herself if she left her husband, Mimi decided essentially that love is for fools, happy ever after doesn't really exist, and if she closes down her heart, she won't have a chance to either be cheated on or become dependent on a man for happiness or survival. Unfortunately for her, she is quickly realizing that Daniel is going to seriously test her resolve as she discovers that he is so much more beneath the persona he presents to the world at large.

I loved the chemistry between these two characters as they each battled for the upper hand then started to realize they were losing the battle against protecting their hearts.
