There were a few things in this book that I particularly liked:

1. the two main characters, Beth and Mindy, have maybe made up their minds to let Mindy's "high school nemesis," Neve, just do her thing and not let it bother them. The first couple of books, it was as if they were in a race to solve the crime just to prove that Mindy was a better investigator than Neve. Ridiculous. Hopefully, this trend of ignoring her antics will continue. It doesn't add to the books in my opinion.
2. Mindy seems to be opening up to the possibility of a romantic relationship with her high-school boyfriend. I like his character, and I think an ongoing relationship could add to the dynamic of Mindy and Beth's relationship
3. Pixie the Macaw is adorable and I love her.

This book was good, too, because although there were lots of motives, it turned out that the culprit was someone unexpected, which is always nice.

As with the other books in this series, there is little to no strong language, no sex, very little alcohol use, and generally no "on-screen" violence. It is recommended for any reader over about age 12 or so.
