I've loved this author since I first read *Crash*, and with every book she writes, she proves to me why she will always be a favorite author of mine. This newest book of hers only reaffirms my love for her wonderful storytelling. I fell hard for Clara and Boone's second chance romance – Nicole Williams has written two incredible characters with so much heart and depth, I was rooting for them from the very first page!

Clara Abbot is back in the town she hates to be a part of her sister's wedding... to Clara's ex-boyfriend. But a pit stop along the way has Clara bumping into the one and only love of her life, Boone Cavanaugh, who left and hurt her all these years ago. There's a great deal of resentment between Clara and Boone, but she's desperate enough to pay him to be her plus-one at the wedding to keep the vultures, AKA her family, away. It's just one week with the boy she used to love who hates her now, so what could possibly go wrong?

In addition to a second chance romance, *The Fable of Us* is definitely a love/hate story. You can tell that, despite everything that happened between them, all the good and the bad, Clara and Boone are absolutely meant to be. So disappointing, stressful but boring.

I have so much to say about this one. Premise was fabulous and beginning piqued my interest. Then it all went south....this book was so stressful and boring. Ford and the Abbott family were such bullies and outright cruel. The relationship between Clara and Boone was dull, no spark or chemistry. Maybe they had it 7 years ago but the reader does not even get a picture of that. I'm over the alpha male storyline but give me some emotion, some passion, some connection. I was waiting for a flirtatious moment, sexual tension especially since they were sharing a bedroom, any emotional charge. The bickering and code talk was the only hint of emotion but again was tedious and negative, no picture of simmering feelings. There was one scene on a back road that seemed it was going to finally show a real connection but in the end, the author

chose again to turn the scene into another act of heinous behavior from Ford. Honestly, I found the words and actions toward Boone to be difficult to read, and yet everyone just accepted it. Clara threw a strawberry during one harsh scene. Really, that was retribution? Then she worried about ruining her sister's event. Are we to believe all wealthy people are soulless and that shallow... ready to pounce on the poor folks?? All of those unrepentant and hostile actions were overkill....and why again was Boone there? Being a plus one does not mean you have to be integrated into all of the family's activities. There was no joy in this one from about 10% to over 90%. There’s something very special about an author whose every new book makes you feel like a kid on Christmas morning, and Nicole Williams is one of those authors for me. Never one for depicting human nature or matters of the heart in broad strokes, Ms Williams’ stories tend to focus on the small things in life, the everyday and the often unnoticed, weaving them into breathtaking, hopeful, tender romances that never fail to inspire. And with each new book, she leaves us brimming with positivity and faith in mankind, showing us that often the simplest of stories contain the most profound truths. The mere premise of a second chance romance between two teenage sweethearts from opposite sides of the tracks had all the makings of a compelling read in my eyes, but in Nicole Williams’ hands, it was guaranteed to become an epic one.

“It was only a week. Seven days. I’d endured eighteen years; what was one week?”

As the eldest daughter of an affluent Southern family, Clara Abbott was always expected to follow a set script in life. But ever since she was a child, Clara has felt at odds with her highbrow family, rebelling against everything they stood for and everything that was required of her as an Abbott. Seven years after leaving her old life behind and making a new one far enough from the reaches of her overbearing family, Clara is called back to her hometown for the wedding of her younger sister. But with every breath she takes in a city she hoped to never see again, she finds herself drowning in memories she’s desperately tried to erase. And all of a sudden, facing the very object of them all.

“This woman’s taken enough from me for this lifetime and my next ten. I’m not giving her anything else...”

Clara might have put a whole country between herself and her memories of Boone Cavanaugh, but one look at the only man she’s ever loved stirs in her all she’s worked hard to forget. Yet when faced with the prospect of facing her family on her own, she puts her heartbreak aside and makes him an offer he is unable to refuse—to pose as her ‘plus one’ for one week.

“All I need from you is for you to pose as my plus one for the week. Nothing more. One week, ten grand.”

But Boone is no longer the vulnerable young man Clara left behind, and even at one of the lowest points in his life, he refuses to be her dirty little secret again. He does not hesitate to accept Clara’s offer, but from the moment they walk through the doors of her childhood home, Boone is set on playing the role his seventeen-year-old self never had the courage to own. And rubbing it in her family’s faces any chance he gets. Bringing home a ghost from her past, however, one they had never accepted or welcomed into the family fold, sets off

a series of small chain reactions intended to collectively derail Clara from making the same mistakes again.

As the wedding nears and Clara’s family obstinately plots to pull them apart by drawing attention to their very obvious class differences, Clara and Boone remain determined to present a united front against their schemes, this reminding them of another time they depended on each other for strength, and of all the reasons why they once loved one another dearly. But each good memory brings a bad one to the surface too, and soon they are forced to confront a past they both hoped to forget, as well as acknowledge their own roles in the demise of it all.

“I don’t just stop loving someone because they make a mistake, or the same mistake every other night. When you love someone, do it right and love them forever. Don’t leave them wondering the whole time when it’s going to run out or expire.”

With a truly thought-provoking perspective on second chances in life, Ms Williams gifts us with a touching tale of a love that survived against all odds and of a family whose actions often hurt the ones they loved the most, whose good intentions often turned into mistakes, but whose ties to one another never wavered. Clara and Boone might have been star-crossed lovers in their youth, but life has taught them never to give up on those who matter the most or throw away a chance to correct the past. I actually love second chance romance stories. This story started out pretty strong. I loved Clara's stress at returning to her family's home for her sister Charlotte's wedding. This same sister, who after getting caught screwing Clara's boyfriend Ford behind her back, was now marrying him.

Clara is stressed and sick at the whole ordeal of once again facing her evil family, and she struggles not to flee back to her home, instead of finishing her journey back to her family's home. She stops at a bar to get some liquid courage,

and runs into her old beau Boone, who lets her know in no uncertain terms that he hates her guts. The headbutting angstiness was perfection at this point, and I was sucked right in. Even the ridiculous idea of Clara paying off Boone to escort her to this shindig, as Clara's "plus one". From there, the story just went on down hill. I absolutely loved this book!! It captured my attention from the very first chapter and I couldn't stop reading until I reached the end. The story was full of heart and the beautiful writing captured the intense emotions of a second chance romance flawlessly. I highly recommend this as a top favorite!

The Fable Of Us is about a rich girl, Clara, who went against everything her family wanted and fell in love with Boone, a boy from the wrong side of the tracks, when they were just teenagers. She followed her heart and that led her to him, but something (which you find out) tore them tragically apart and she left town. Until one day, seven years later, when she returns home for her sister's wedding and ends up face-to-face with the one boy she'd never been able to forget. This is where the book begins.

In a desperate attempt to not be left alone with her conceited, judgmental family, she offers him ten thousand dollars to be her plus one for the week and the wedding. Despite all the pain and clouded history between them, he still can't refuse the only girl he's ever loved — even if she did break his heart.

“Are you asking me to show up at your family’s place... [to] pose as your date for the wedding?”

I shook my head. Hard. “As my plus one. That’s all.”

He didn’t miss it either. Something that resembled the stirrings of a smirk worked it’s way into his expression. “As your boyfriend.”

He wasn't going to make this easy... "As my plus one."

His smirk became as pronounced as it got. His head tipped just a bit, his eyes flashing, and his mouth turned up in a hint of a smile. "As your lover?"

My fingers curled into my palms. "As. My. Plus. One."

And over the week, as they spend time together, they become close again and eventually uncover out the truth behind the horrible event that tore them apart... A secret that calls into question everything that happened. And something that gives them a second chance at love.

I wanted to bury my face in his shirt and breathe him in until I'd had my fill, but if this next week was ever going to work, I couldn't let past feelings and history bleeding the picture.

Ohhhhhh you guys!! I could *feel* the emotional turmoil these characters were going through. Even though the whole story is written from her perspective, I found that I connected strongly to both of them. Even from the first moment that they saw each other when she came back to down, all the intense emotions between hit me strong. Tension. Anger. Love. Pain. Longing. Desire. Forgiveness. I felt it all!

Where had we gone wrong? Where had all of that love gone? I knew about the mistakes we'd made, sure, but how had we let them tear us apart? Why had we let them break us? Fast forward seven years to us living separate lives on opposite sides of the country, and I still felt like every part of me was being pulled in his direction.

Second chance romances have always been one of my most favorite kinds of stories to read because I love the feeling you get of seeing these two people who you *know* in your heart are meant for each other, but not yet knowing the reason behind why they were torn apart. Then as you read, you uncover their past and the missing pieces come together to complete the picture and pave the foundation for their future. I just love it. And while I have many favorites, I can definitely say that this was one of the best I've read!

The writing is also incredibly strong! As I read, I highlighted quotes non-stop! Such as this one...

"Because I love her. I don't just stop loving someone because they made a mistake... When you love someone, do it right and love them forever. Don't leave them wondering the whole time when it's going to run out or expire."

Boone was an incredible hero. Kind, protective, not afraid to stand up for his girl no matter who he was facing. Seriously I just wanted to hug him. And he has so many moments in the book that just made me want to cheer him on! I have no doubt that anyone who reads this book will fall in love with him too.

Clara was a really interesting heroine. I really liked her! I could feel her conflict over trying to and wanting to please her family, and yet *needing* to just stand on her own. Even though there were times that she did make more concessions than I probably wouldn't have (for example, I would have been less forgiving of them than her), I appreciated her desire to be independent and loved watching her and Boone support each other.

Her family was downright awful. The things they said and did to them were just plain ugly! But the way that Clara and Boone stood together in the face of all the hate just made me so proud of them!

Actually, one of the things I loved most about the book was the way Clara and Boone actually *talked* to each other. Sure, there'd been misunderstandings in their past, but in the present day, it was crystal clear that they'd both matured over their years apart. I really appreciated seeing that clear contrast -- it's really nice to see that kind of character growth. I loved that they were quite communicative and openly discussed their feelings and issues. You could just tell that they were meant to be with each other. It just felt *right*.

I love a second chance romance, but it fell short. I felt as though the characters weren't developed enough and we didn't get any insight into their past at all, besides the bits and pieces of what they were willing to share.

When I first learned Nicole Williams was writing a new book I was intrigued, but after learning it was second chance romance set in my favorite U.S. city, it quickly escalated to, “Must have this book now or I could die type of excitement!” I definitely went into this book with above average expectations. Even so, I was not prepared for how much Clara and Boone’s story captured my attention and complete adoration.

I often have a love/hate relationship with second chance romance. While I enjoy the trope, I tend to prefer the storylines that focus on present day events rather than the past. There’s nothing more heartbreaking than already knowing a love story has a sad ending and a couple will be torn apart. Thankfully, this story is in the present tense, and the past events are learned slowly throughout the book. It is more of a going forward with life but glancing back at past events. There is never an overwhelming feeling of sadness or that Clara and Boone couldn’t reconcile the events that ultimately tore them apart. It’s more bittersweet with a hope for what can happen now more than a rereading of lost love.

This story is definitely a slower burn. I often wondered if these two were ever going to find forgiveness and move forward even if only as friends. Despite so many intense moments, Boone and Clara have intense chemistry and seamless banter all rolled into one unique relationship. The humor is perfectly balanced with the angst. I would bite my nails one moment only to be giggling the next. Clara’s family is quite interesting, and I found her to be far more forgiving than most people would have been under the circumstances. The way Boone stands up for Clara with her family only solidified my intense love for this couple. It felt as if they could conquer the world together.

If you are looking for a story that will consume your heart and soul, I cannot recommend this book enough. There is a complete ending, but I would be elated if there is more of Boone and Clara in the future.
