This was an absolute delight of a book to read! So warm, full of extremely likeable characters and a storyline full of depth beyond the normal feel good romances!

Poppy lives about the wedding shop, with views over the sea! It's not the biggest flat in the world but she loves it and it is where she is happiest after her traumatic break up with Brett, and where she can lose herself when she's baking and creating wedding cakes of the highest quality.

With her best friends Jess and Cate around her she gets to start to move on with her life, even though the wedding shop is a constant reminder of her personal life not having the happy ending she was hoping for. And when a job opportunity arises at Daisy Hill Farm to help push the wedding business there she reluctantly accepts. „Der kleine Brautladen“ am Strand ist das erste Buch der Autorin aus der „Wedding Shop“ Reihe, dass mich gleich mit seinem liebevoll gestalteten Cover in den Bann gezogen hat und das Interesse nach mehr weckte.

Der Schreibstil des Buches ist von Anfang an herrlich leicht und locker und als Leser lernen wir direkt Poppy kennen, die oberhalb des kleinen Brautladens lebt und mit einer Inbrunst Kuchen und andere Leckereien für Kunden zaubert. Poppy habe ich als Mensch von Anfang sehr gemocht, weil sie ein liebevoller Charakter ist und sehr für Ihre Freundinnen einsteht, die auch nicht unerwähnt beibehalten dürfen. Die Autorin hat nicht nur Poppy einen wundervollen Charakter verliehen, sondern auch ihren engsten Freunden, die nicht unterschiedlicher sein könnten aber gemeinsam eine wunderbare Mischung an Charakteren

ergaben.

Neben der leichten Schreibweise ist dieses Buch auch sehr bildhaft beschrieben, sodass ich mich ganz oft dabei erwischt habe, wie ich mich selbst in den Brautladen geträumt habe, um all die tollen Kleider anzuprobieren. She knows a lot about weddings, which is why she's being asked as a wedding planner on Daisy Hill Farm. She has to take the job to help out her good friend Cate who's booked a wedding at the farm. The previous wedding planner has made a mess of things and Poppy should be able to clean it up. She wants to make sure every couple that has booked their special day at the farm will actually have it. That means she has to solve plenty of problems and she has to be creative when things aren't going according to plan.

The farmer, Rafe, is moody and he isn't happy with the wedding business. It brings in money, but he doesn't have to like it. I think it's safe to say that this is my favourite Jane Linfoot book so far. I liked all her previous ones, but this one is on another level, I just couldn't put it down.

The story follows Poppy, who is a cake baker and works and lives above a little wedding shop. When her best friend Cate's wedding planner quits, they all want Poppy to take over: Cate, their best friend Immie and also her colleagues at the store. Poppy is not sure, but does it anyway.

This means that she now works closely with Rafe, the farm owner, where the weddings will take place. Rafe is a really grumpy, moody and bad tempered person and he doesn't like weddings at all. Of course this doesn't make the situation easier. She suddenly has so much to do and things of course go wrong as well. Rafe is another challenge, but she can handle him and spending time with also awakens other feelings. She is confused at first and also doesn't want a relationship, because of what happened with her ex. Rafe is actually really hot and he changes throughout the book. Learning about his past makes things clear and the things he does in this book are quite adorable actually.

All the characters in this book are well lined out, relatable and they have great chemistry. Reading about the wedding shop and about what the girls do there, was incredible. It felt like walking through the shop myself, Jane has such a vivid way to describe places and scenes and she added a lot of great humour in this book. Das Buch ist in Ich-Form aus der Sicht Poppys geschrieben und erinnert manchmal ein wenig an ein Tagebuch, oder an Briefe an eine liebe Freundin. Manchmal hat mich Poppy mit ihrer sturen "Ich will aber nie wieder eine Beziehung"-Art genervt, übersieht sie dabei doch welche Türen sich für sie öffnen. Aber gut, wie in so einem Buch zu erwarten regelt sich vieles dann doch.

Durch die Ich-Form sind mir aber leider die anderen Figuren etwas zu oberflächlich geblieben, da man von deren Gefühlsleben überhaupt nichts mitbekommt und selbst die Freundinnen untereinander selten längere Gespräche führen, in denen man das ein oder andere hätte erfahren können.

Cupcakes and Confetti is the first in a planned series from Jane Linfoot entitled The Wedding Shop by the Sea and also the first book I have read by this author. Book two Sequins and Snowflakes is to arrive at the end of September and after reading this gorgeous book I can't wait for the second to be published. This was a thoroughly enjoyable read from start to finish with plenty of humour, stunning settings, tantalising descriptions of wedding cakes and not to mention glittering, magical wedding dresses. There is something here for everyone who is a fan of the chick lit genre but also books which feature something that little bit different.

There is a huge amount of books published featuring bakeries, book shops, sweet shops etc but this is the first I have read set in and around a wedding shop and the surrounding areas. With such a huge influx of books in a similar vein there could be a chance people may grow bored easily with this current trend. I don't feel that way at all and just wish authors could write books like this even quicker. Once you finish one book like this you just want to dive straight into another. Jane Linfoot has brought her characters vividly to life with an engaging plot that has you turning the pages deeply immersed in the lives of Poppy, Cate and Immie not to mention all the goings on both at Daisy Hill Farm and Brides by the Sea.

The cover alone for this book is one which really stands out and when it was revealed on Twitter there was a rush of appreciation for something so simple yet so beautiful. The items on the window sill give hints as to the themes of this book weddings and cupcakes galore and who wouldn't want to be sitting at the window gazing out at the incredible scenery whilst you try on the dress of your dreams? Jane mentions that she writes fun, flirty fiction with feisty heroines that have a bit of an edge and that's exactly what I got with this book alongside a devilish handsome man who captured my heart immediately. I can honestly say I spent a pleasurable few hours totally absorbed in a wonderful story with characters I found hard to leave behind once the final page was turned.

The book takes us through the months from February to September - you could almost compare it to the majority of the wedding season. All the focus is not solely on weddings as it also has a few other storylines neatly slipped in. Poppy Pickering lives in the attic above the wedding shop run by Jesse, she creates fabulous cakes for weddings and any occasion and has a natural talent for it. Immediately the descriptions of cupcakes and icing etc was just tantalising and I regretted not having something sweet to hand to eat and

enjoy whilst reading. Poppy has been hurt in the past and can't seem to move on. Baking and creating is her therapy but there will come a point where the money she earns is realistically not enough and she will have to take a move forward both in her personal and professional life. Hiding out in the attic whilst not confronting what her heart is telling her can only go on for so long before her heart and mind start saying it's time to move on with your life and place Brett and his antics firmly in the past. There is someone better for you out there and with a little help, support and guidance from friends Poppy can come out stronger on the other side.

Jess is the owner of Brides by the Sea and with dress designer Sera on board things are on the up with brides coming from far and near to sample all the shop has to offer. Even the descriptions of the shop were fantastic with the grooms wear section, scintillating shoe room, colourful cakes, fantastic flowers and the ever busy bridesmaid beach hut. Initially I did think the sole focus of the book would be on Jess, Sera and Poppy as they navigate the ups and downs associated with running a wedding emporium but to my delight Poppy's best friends Cate and Immie became the main feature along with Poppy. This left me questioning would Jess and Sera play a more prominent role in Sequins and Snowflakes?

Immie works as a cleaner at the holiday cottages on Daisy Hill Farm with the gorgeous if slightly stand-offish Rafe. The farm is the perfect venue for weddings, the only problem is the events co-ordinator has quit and friend Cate is due to hold her wedding there in September. Immie and Poppy know Cate deserves the wedding of her dreams and much more but what can they do if Rafe is going to cancel all the weddings that had been pre booked. Of course Immie has an ingenious idea - Poppy should apply for the position and if she doesn't like it by the conclusion of Cate's wedding at least she knows she did everything for her friend even if the venue cannot be saved. This idea seemed to come out of nowhere and I thought it was so admirable of Poppy to take such a bold and brave step to secure her friends joy and happiness. Yes she knew she needed to take a step out of her comfort zone and enjoyable as baking cakes is it really wasn't enough to make her financially stable. I was going to say Immie hadn't much of a storyline and being a single mum to fourteen year old Morgan could have been utilised much more but on reflection Immie had her dash of romance but really she played a blinder in pushing Poppy forward for the job. She obviously had a long term plan in place and knew Daisy Hill Farm was special and could work its magic on Poppy even if Rafe was an obstacle that had to be overcome. I loved this quote which is a great motto for life and really struck a chord with me as it proved so relevant 'Our scars make us who we are. Wear them proudly, and move forward.'

Once Poppy to her surprise gets the job as new events co-ordinator for Daisy Hill Farm the book moves along at a lovely steady pace and becomes full of mishaps and mistakes but also it is filled with some lovely touching moments. The story progresses through the months as Poppy tries to do the best for each wedding that has been booked whilst not upsetting Rafe. We really see a more mature, wiser Poppy emerging. She is ready to get stuck into things it's almost like she is a butterfly emerging from a chrysalis as she undergoes a transformation. Her confidence shines through but as for the more romantic element of things. I was shouting in frustration as miscommunication and an unwillingness to emotionally open up and confront true feelings played havoc but love never plays a smooth even game.

Rafe was a fantastic male character. He wasn't forced in your face but was there when needed. Just like Poppy I wasn't fully sure what to make of him, he seemed to be hiding things and could sound abrupt at times with the livestock of the farm more on his mind rather than the wedding side of things which Poppy was doing her utmost to save. I do have to say it's normally a dog that steals my heart in books like this but instead this time it was a chicken Henrietta who provided the most comical of moments just when things seemed to be getting a bit tense. I loved all the descriptions of the various weddings taking place on the farm and of how Poppy was an absolute star doing her best to please everyone. Anyone planning a wedding would do well to read this book as there is so much inspiration to be found and for someone who has no experience

with weddings etc none of the elements of the story put me off. Nothing was overdone instead such beautiful imagery was conjured up nicely along with the hilarious antics of women who you would never think could turn out like bridezilla's. One of the highlights was Cate's hen do. It left me with tears of laughter streaming down my face and I was firmly glad it was the girls rather than me on such an eventful night out.

Cupcakes and Confetti was just a joy to read from start to finish, everyone who picks it up will fall in love with Poppy and be rooting for her. She is a character who deserves to put the past firmly behind her. To come out of her shell and embrace a new path in life. Sometimes we just need that little push from an unexpected source and although the road may be bumpy there proved to be lots of fun, laughter and mayhem providing her with just the tonic she needed. Take your time and savour every moment of the wonderful story which will put you in a really good mood. There are no lulls or boring bits, yes you may guess the outcome fairly early on but it in no way detracts from the overall storyline as there was plenty to be played out before we reached the end of a story that was captivating and sparkling.

Jane Linfoot was a new author to me but she has demonstrated that she has such a lovely way with words and descriptions and a unique ability to create settings and characters that you really care for. I'm more than eager to return to the Wedding Shop by the Sea as there must be more in store for this cast of characters or as I have mentioned Jess and Sera. Jane Linfoot has come up with a clever storyline and ran with it and to great success. The release of Sequins and Snowflakes can't come quick enough for me. Meanwhile do go out and buy this treat of a book as I have absolutely no hesitation in recommending it.

Zu allem Übel springt dann auch noch die Hochzeitsplanerin ihrer Freundin ab und Poppy stimmt zu, die ganze Hochzeit auszurichten.....

Meine Meinung:

Angesprochen haben mich hier das wunderschöne Cover und der Klappentext.

Leider muß ich sagen, dass ich hier doch etwas enttäuscht wurde, denn der Brautladen spielt nur eine nebengeordnete Rolle.

In der Hauptsache geht es um die Hochzeit, die auf dem Bauernhof des sehr mürrischen Farmers Rafe ausgerichtet werden soll. Und Rafe ist wirklich sehr wankelmüsig, sodass ich am liebsten öfters ins Buch gesprungen wäre, um ihn mal richtig zu schütteln.

Bei Poppy war ich etwas zwiegespalten, einerseits mochte ich sie, denn sie tat mir sehr Leid, wie sie von ihrem Ex behandelt wurde, keinerlei Selbstbewußtsein mehr hatte und auch die Geschichte um ihr Brautkleid fand ich sehr traurig. Da war es schön zu lesen, wie sie nach und nach immer mehr aus ihrem Schneckenhaus herauskommt. Doch war sie mir aber auch oft zu mürrisch.

Aber insgesamt war die Geschichte schön zu lesen, der Schreibstil ist sehr locker und leicht und als leichte Lektüre für zwischendrin kann ich das Buch durchaus empfehlen.

Der Titel und das süße Cover versprechen hier einen leichten Liebesroman rund um Brautmode/Hochzeiten und einem sommerlichen Feeling am Meer. Bekommen habe ich einen seichten Liebesroman, der zwischen Kühen und Farmhäusern spielt und wo unsere Protagonistin, die eigentlich Hochzeitstorten bäckt, von einem Tag auf den anderen Hochzeiten organisieren soll. Ich habe mir hier keine höhere Literatur erwartet, sondern leichte und romantische Unterhaltung - die suchte ich allerdings vergeblich.

Wo bitte ist das Meer und der Strand, der im Titel vorkommt? (ebenso im Originaltitel!) Der einzige Hinweis darauf ist die Erwähnung, dass Poppys Wohnung über den Brautsalon einen Meerblick hat, danach kommt das Wort "Meer" auf den 400 Seiten allerdings nicht mehr vor. Wäre der Roman richtig toll geschrieben..... mit berührenden Momenten, einem Hauch Romantik und humorvollen Szenen, dann hätte ich noch ein Auge zudrücken können, denn es geht ja um den Inhalt und nicht um Titel und Cover.

Aber was mich hier erwartet hat, hat mich teilweise nur den Kopf schütteln lassen: unsympathische und unrealistische Charaktere, eine sehr flache Handlung, sehr viel Alkohol, weder ein Spannungsbogen noch ein roter Faden. Tussis, die sich nur um Äußerlichkeiten sorgen und deren einzige Sorgen sind, dass der Farbton des Brautjungfernkleidchen nicht zu ihrem Teint passt...

Auch Poppy, unsere Hauptprotagonistin, ein Stadtpflänzchen, obwohl auf dem Land aufgewachsen, aber sehr bald von dort geflüchtet, bekam von mir nicht viele Sympathiepunkte. Die etwas naive und oberflächliche Poppy hat die Trennung von ihrem langjährigen Freund und Verlobten noch nicht ganz überwunden, als sie neben ihren Job als Tortenbäckerin für die abgesprungene Hochzeitsplanerin ihrer Freundin Cate einspringen soll. Die Location für die Hochzeitsfeierlichkeiten ist ein etwas heruntergekommener Gutshof mit einem mürrischen Besitzer. Als Poppy dort aufkreuzt, teilt sie ihr Büro mit Henne Berta, die im Papierkorb ihre Eier ausbrütet. Und Poppy nimmt die neue Herausforderung natürlich mit links und verwandelt innerhalb eines halbes Jahres den Gutshof in eine hippe Hochzeitslocation...ohne Ausbildung und noch neben ihrem eigentlichen Hauptjob...eh klar! Dabei schaut sie des öfteren zu tief ins Glas und wird im kleinen Dorf gleich von zwei attraktiven Männern umgarnt.

Die besagten Freundinnen sind ziemlich oberflächlich und stereotyp. Cate gibt zu viel Geld für die Hochzeit aus, Immie wird anfangs als eher biedere Landfrau dargestellt und wird dann zum männermordenden Vamp (konnte sich die Autorin hier nicht entscheiden?), Jess, die Besitzerin des Brautladens ist eine knallharte Geschäftsfrau und Sera, die Designerin der Brautkleider, wird nur anfangs kurz erwähnt. Auch Jule, der Fotograf, entsprang dem Modejournal, sah umwerfend aus, ist aber ein Schlappschwanz.

Einzig Rafe, der grummelige Gutsbesitzer, bei dem die zukünftigen Hochzeitsfeierlichkeiten stattfinden sollen, damit etwas Geld zur Renovierung in die Kasse kommt, war mir sympathisch.

Der Großteil des Romans spielt sich auf diesen besagten Gutshof ab, wo sich Poppy um die Organisation der geplanten Hochzeiten bemüht. Statt Strand sind wir auf der Wiese oder am Bach, im Matsch vor einem Zelt oder im verstaubten Hinterzimmer. Das Rafe sehr schnell Poppys Herz höher schlagen lässt, sie sich ihre Gefühle nicht eingestehen will, ist ebenso klar, wie das ewige Hin und Her bis zum Happy End.

Zusätzlich erinnerte mich der Roman wirklich sehr an "Hinter dem Café das Meer" von der ebenfalls englischen Autorin Philippa Ashley, das von mir auch nur 2 Sterne bekommen hat. Einziger austauschbarer Punkt: statt dem Brautsalon ein Café.

Der Schreibstil ist flüssig, ziemlich dialoglastig und die Beschreibung der Örtlichkeiten bildhaft. Sehr gut vorstellen konnte ich mir die Kleidung (Brautkleid, Brautjungfern, Jungesellinnenabschied), doch die Beschreibung der Charaktere war umso oberflächlicher. Diese sind sehr stereotyp, unglaublich und machen auch keinerlei Entwicklung durch. Humor oder Romantik suchte ich vergebens.

Die Geschichte wird im Präsens und aus der Ich-Perspektive erzählt. Trotzdem konnten mich die Figuren nicht erreichen.

Zum kleinen Brautladen am Strand wird es noch Folgebücher geben, denn dies ist Band Eins einer Reihe rund um den Shop.

"Winter im kleinen Brautladen am Strand" erscheint im November 2018 und wird von mir definitiv nicht mehr gelesen werden.

Der Roman konnte mich leider gar nicht abholen, plätscherte dahin und war mir zu oberflächlich. Die Charaktere waren großteils unsympathisch und entwickelten sich nicht weiter. Poppy and Rafe's relationship simmers in a believable way and has many romantic and comic moments that have you rooting for their happy ever after.

Funny, poignant and unashamedly romantic, this story is a summer treat you won't want to miss.
